The Tribal Culture Fair on September 21 and 22, at Siletz is a celebration of History and Culture.

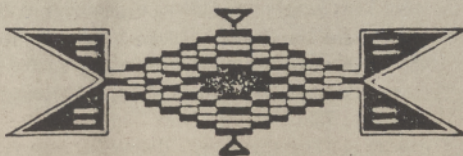
All interested persons are encouraged to participate by viewing the displays, touching the exhibits and enjoying the entertainment.

Project HEAD START

Project Head Start is a demonstration program which provides comprehensive developmental services for low-income preschool children. Since its inception in 1965, Head Start has provided educational, social, medical, dental, nutrition and mental health services to over nine million children and their families across the nation. Launched by the Office of Economic Opportunity, it is now administered by the Administration for Children, Youth and Families in the Department of Health and Human Services. As an innovative program, it has had a significant impact upon the thinking of educators, psychologists and other specialists in the child development field.

In 1983, Washington, D.C. compiled a report on their evaluation studies that shows Head Start continues to produce the following gains:

- Improvement in the children's performance on school achievement tests, including reading; gains in cognitive development; and fewer grade retentions and special class placements;
- Positive impact on child socialization and the development of socially mature behavior;
- Lower absenteeism from school, fewer cases of anemia, more immunizations, better nutritional practices, and generally better health; and
- A positive impact on the attitudes of parents toward their children, favorable changes in interactions between mothers and their children, and an increase in later parent participation in public schools.

The Siletz Tribal Head Start Program has begun its annual recruitment of low-income Indian families with children ages 3 through 5.

Classes for preschool children are scheduled to begin Sept. 23, 1985 at Siletz Elementary School.
