Tax Bill Will Devastate Programs

The Gramm-Rudman Tax Bill recently enacted by the U.S. Congress will have a significant negative impact on federal assistance to Indian Tribes. Although no firm figures have been released detailing specific cuts to Indian programs, sources in Washington have confirmed that funding for such crucial programs as education, housing, and health services may soon fall victim in the fight to reduce the federal deficit.

According to Alex Luderman, President of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe:

"So far, all we have heard is rumors, but if they cut our programs as much as we have heard, we'll be in pretty bad shape. We depend upon federal funding for social services and enterprise development.

If tribes develop tax codes they can better plan for the future . . . get the resources they need to become self-sufficient. The bureaucratic middlemen haven't helped us much, and it looks like we won't be able to depend on them any more. If they'd only do what they say . . . we go to Washington over and over again, but nothing happens. They're not really helping us at all."

Indian tribes and organizations concerned with the effects of the Gramm-Rudman Bill will meet in New Orleans, Louisiana on February 12, 13 and 14, 1986 for a Seminar entitled TAXATION and INDIAN AFFAIRS. This 3 day session will provide participants training and information concerning the Indian Tribal Government Tax Status Act, and its provisions which allow tribes to obtain a stable source of revenue to replace the impending reduction in federal assistance.

TAXATION and INDIAN AFFAIRS is presented by the Institute for Indian Development and the Zientz Pirtle Law Firm. It will be held at the New Orleans Hilton Hotel.
