The past few months have been extremely busy ones for Council as well as staff. We have prepared budgets for both tribal government and tribal operations. The budget reductions the federal government has imposed on tribes haven't had a severe effect on the tribe this year, however, we know they will in the near future.

Plans for opening the Portland Area Office have been finalized and interviews have taken place for the office Supervisor position. Due to the low number of applicants for the Secretary and Community

Health Nurse position, we will re-advertise these two positions. We hope to have the office open and operating by December 1, 1986.

Council has continued to pursue our Land Acquisition project. There are many rumors floating around about our efforts. Please

understand, no decisions have been made. The Tribe is merely studying new and innovative ways that the timber could be managed if we are able to obtain additional lands. Whether or not we are able to obtain the land may depend on how timber is managed. Tribal members will be kept informed as we progress.

Restoration Day is fast approaching. It's been nine years since the tribe was restored. The tribal holiday falls on a Tuesday this year, but the Tribal Council voted to celebrate the occasion on Saturday, November 15, 1986. We hope to have a good turnout. An agenda will be published in the next newsletter.

The newsletter will be published on a bi-monthly basis starting with this edition. See you at the Restoration celebration.

Siletz Track Project

Construction of the Siletz jogging track was approved by Lincoln County School District Superintendent, John Erickson, at a meeting at Siletz School on September 24th. The track was to be completed during the summer, but the school district is behind with its construction schedule. Some of the ground preparation, and planning is being done with the school district maintenance department.

The track is to be financed by contributions raised by the Siletz Tribe, Boosters, Fire Department, School, and community. Work will be done by volunteer labor and donated equipment. Work is being scheduled to begin the second week in October. The track will be built according to the original plans, except that cedar bark will be substituted for cinders. Cedar bark will not interfere with maintenance equipment, does not require a wood retaining border, and is a soft surface for walking and jogging. We are planning an October 18-19 construction time, weather permitting. If you would like to help build the track, please call Siletz School, 444-2523.
