The Tribe's Management and Operations Manual defines immediate family as "husband, wife, mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, or any other person who is a member of the employee's household". Re-read the above definition, substituting the term "employee" with that of "pageant judge". Do you believe such a definition would serve to avoid a conflict of interest on the part of a prospective judge? If not, what other family relationships would you include?

What criteria should be the basis for judging pageant candidates (i.e. Knowledge of family & tribal history, knowledge and skill in Siletz dances, knowledge & presentation of regalia, poise & personality, etc.)? How would criteria differ for Little Miss and Miss Siletz? How would you assign points for each criterion?

What would you identify as the responsibilities of Miss Siletz? Of Little Miss Siletz?

How should the pageant be funded (i.e. fundraising, timber revenues, combination of fundraising & timber revenues)?

Whipman & Whipwoman:

Through resolutions, the Tribal Council has designated Gilbert "Zeke" Towner and Pauline Ricks as the Tribe's whipman and whipwoman. Both served in these roles at the 1986 NESIKA ILLAHEE pow-wow. At the February 21-22, 1987 meeting, Council requested that an ad hoc committee develop guidelines for the whipman and whipwoman. What guidelines would you recommend for these roles?

Completed surveys can be turned in at or mailed to any of the Tribe's Area Offices. As noted before, your comments will be used to develop permanent guidelines and we will try to publish results of the survey in the next newsletter. Thank you for participating.
