AA Meetings Change

The Native American Group of Alcoholics Anonymous Meetings have been changed to Saturday nights beginning at 7:30 p.m. at the Siletz Tribal Community Center.

Future "Speaker Meetings" will be held on the fourth Saturday of each month.

On Saturday, October 24th beginning at 7:30 p.m., Riley P. of Native American from Sheridan, will be our guest speaker.

The "Just Say No" group was active this past summer vacation with 5 to 7 kids participating each week. They held hot dog roasts behind the Community Center. Four canned heat cans were used for the fire and it worked quite well.

The group was involved in the Pow Wow Parade. Their sponsor, the Newport Optimist Club, furnished 25 pounds of candy to throw to bystanders.

In August the "Just Say No" Club went on a white water rafting trip at Maupin. There were 20 students from grades 4-5-6 involved. It was Irene Holland's, CHN, idea + to utilize the RISK Team (Recreation Intervention Strategy for Kids) of Chemawa. RISK is a recreation specialist team. Incidentally, this team can be used by any Native American group and it should be, because the team is not used enough at present. RISK also does white water rafting in the winter, using wet suits. The team also does cross country skiing. This writer brought up the question, "I cannot ski". The answer was, "that's why we are here", very interesting. They stay in lodges and they also make snow camps.

We took one group on the 11th and came back on the 12th. We took another group on the 13th. The last group included students from the 7th grade on up. These students went into a little rougher white water. Also, the theme for the first group was "prevention" whereas the theme for the older group was "intervention".

I think our biggest problem was the time factor. We expected to return with our first group at 8:00 p.m., and actually returned at 11:00 p.m. So we adjusted the return time of the second group by 3 hours, but again we ran 3 hours behind our schedule.

The first group was broken into raft teams of: Dave, staff member of Chemawa; Bobbi Duarte (Bynum); David Duarte; Heather Helm; Spring Claypool, and Moriah Claypool who were known as the "Streamers".

John Meyers, a teacher from Siletz; Nathan Bynum; Kelly Johnson; Mike Keene, and Tyee Russell were the "Sea Serpents".

Eddie, staff member from Chemawa; Sanya Russell; Vickie Tomm; Kenji Neskai; Trisha Christianson; Fawn Keen, and Irene Holland, CHN, made up the team of "Eddie's Cruisers".

Calvin, staff member from Chemawa; Keith Rossom; John Donelson; Weston Strickler, and George Blacketer were named the "Weeny Arms".

George made the trip more interesting when he decided to be the inspector of the bottom of the raft, right in the middle of the rapids! They had a great time dumping water on other rafts, if no raft was available...you guessed it. Ask Irene.

The staff people from Siletz on this trip were: John Meyers, Irene Holland, and Walt Klamath who was the Bus Driver.

On the second trip the older students did not break up into rafting teams as such, but went to the rafts they wished to be on. The games played were equally exciting and they stressed team work and self-worth. Students from the Siletz area were: Jason Simmons, Levi Simmons, and annual Bayya. Salem area: John Bostwick and Michele W rd. From Portland: James Mays, Beverly Bennet, Teresa Geiszler, and Mathew Everett. Staff from the Siletz Area: Lisa Brown, Receptionist at the Tribal Center and her fiancée Charlie Darold; Frances Klamath, housewife; Walt Klamath, Bus Driver; and Irene Holland, CHN.

These trips were very interesting, as well as fun and educational. If anyone would like more information on how to form an expedition for rafting they can contact Irene Holland, CHN at the Tribe's Portland Area Office, or Walt Klamath in Siletz at the Aldridge House. Walt's office hours are Wednesdays from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. We will be glad to help in areas of Alcohol .. Drug Abuse Education, Prevention, and Intervention.

I would personally like to thank all of the staff at Central Office for the wonderful cooperation they have extended to me and Irene during this planning process. 10:00 am - 1:00 pm

The cultural fishing season will begin October 1, through November 30.

Please note the following:

As a licensed Tribal member you are required to report your successful kills within 12 hours and your successful fish caught within 72 hours. You can do this by calling the Hunting & Fishing Liaison toll free 1-800-922-1399 or 444-2532 at your cost. You can also mail the information to the Hunting & Fishing Liaison, P.O. Box 549 Siletz, OR 97380. Please when you call in make note of who you give your information to and the date. You should receive a post card within five working days noting the information you called in or mailed in. Keep this post card as your receipt. If you do not receive a post card PLEASE call back. It is very important that you follow through to insure you hunting/fishing privileges. No late tag notices will be mailed this year, and NO list of names will be printed in the Siletz News this year.
