DRUMMING & DANCE CLASSES BEGIN

In response to repeated requests and following much discussion a one-year project to teach traditional Siletz and inter-tribal drumming and dancing is underway. This effort involves classes held three days a week in the Tribal Community Center. Sunday afternoons will be devoted to instruction, with two weekday evenings set aside for practices. This project is sponsored through the Tribe's Culture and Adult Education Program and coordinated by Bruce "SnoBall" Butler. At present Bruce has confirmed two instructors and is in the process of contacting others.

Paul Whitehead, a Kootnai Indian, will teach men's inter-tribal straight dancing. Paul, well known among the Siletz community, is a past resident and has many years experience teaching dance for Title IV and JOM programs in Eugene, Springfield, and Siletz.

Instructor for inter-tribal drumming is Fermin Sanchez, a Shoshone-Bannock Indian from Fort Hall, Idaho. Fermin has recently moved to Siletz and is eager to share his 25 years of drumming experience with tribal members. His goal by project's end is that participants will be able to perform six songs: Flag, Grand Entry, Men's Traditional, Women's Traditional, and two inter-tribals. If time and abilities allow he hopes to include a Sneak-Up and a Crow Hop song.

In teaching traditional Siletz songs and dances, Bruce hopes to tap the expertise of several instructors. Presently, he is contacting individuals who've either previously taught or have indicated willingness to teach these classes. TURKEY-BARLEY SOUP

3 cups Chicken Broth
2 cups cooked barley
1 cup sliced green beans
1 cup diced onion
1 cup diced celery
1 cup diced carrots
1/2 cup canned crushed tomatoes
1 bay leaf
1/2 teaspoon thyme leaves
12 ounces skinned and boned cooked turkey, cubed
1 teaspoon salt
Dash pepper
Chopped fresh parsley to garnish

Heat broth in medium saucepan. Add next 8 ingredients to broth and simmer until vegetables are tender. Add turkey, salt, and pepper, and cook 5 to 10 minutes. Remove bay leaf and sprinkle soup with parsley before serving.
