**INDIAN BUSINESS
 DEVELOPMENT GRANTS**

IBDG funding has been made available for FY 90. In order to review applications, all applications must be received at the Siletz Agency by January 12, 1990 to allow for adequate time to review.

Criteria for grants will be pursuant to 25 CFR 286.17, as follows:

1. Purpose (286.2) - To stimulate and increase Indian entrepreneurship and employment through establishment, acquisition or expansion of profit-making Indian owned economic enterprises which will contribute to the economy of a reservation.
2. Eligible Applicants (286.3) - Applicants must have a form of organization acceptable to the commissioner and unable to meet their total financing from their own resources and by loans from other sources such as banks, Farmers Home Administration, Small Business Administration, Production Credit Associations, Etc.
3. Location of Enterprises (286.7) - To be eligible for a grant an economic enterprise must be located on Indian Reservation or located where it makes or will make an economic contribution to a nearby reservation by providing employment to tribal members residing thereon or be expending a portion of its income for materials or services on the reservation.
4. Priority (286.8) - The following priority will be used in selecting economic enterprises for grant funds:
 - a. First Priority. First priority will be given to economic enterprises located on a reservation that will:
 1. Utilize Indian resources, both natural and human.
 2. Create the highest ratio of Indian jobs to the total amount of dollars to be invested, including market value of materials and equipment contributed to the project.
 3. Create the highest ratio of income to a tribe or its members in relation to the total amount of dollars to be invested, including market value of materials or equipment contributed to the project.
 4. Generate the most non-Bureau financing.

Incomplete applications will not be considered. The applicants must have a firm commitment for the 75 percent of the necessary financing from the other sources.
