The Draft Environmental Assessment looks at the effects of carrying out each of several Alternatives, including No Action, of harvesting approximately 195 acres of mature timber on the Siletz Indian Reservation.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about February 23, 1990 the above-named Indian Tribe will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:

The construction of a Community Health Clinic in Siletz, Lincoln County, Oregon. Upon completion, this facility would function as a full service ambulatory health care center for members of the Siletz Tribe and other American Indians residing in Lincoln and Benton counties. Services would also be extended to the local, non-native population. Total estimated cost of the project is \$364,000, of which \$250,000 have been awarded under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the above-named Indian Tribe has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The Reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

The site of construction is very stable, nearly flat ground zoned Commercial in Siletz, Oregon. The Health Clinic will benefit the small business core, and allow the Tribe to better manage its health care system.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Indian Tribe which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying upon request at the Siletz Tribal Community Center between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians to the Tribal Council Chairman. Such written comments should be received at Post Office Box 549, Siletz, Oregon 97380 on or before February 23, 1990. All such comments so received will be considered and the Siletz Tribe will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Siletz Tribe is certifying to HUD that the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and Delores Pigsley, in her official capacity as Tribal Council Chairman consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decisionmaking and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians may use the Block Grant funds and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the certifying officer or other officer of applicant approved by HUD; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58) and may be addressed to HUD at Arcade Plaza Building, Mail Stop 10PIC, 1321 Second Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98101, ATTN: Richard Putnam.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after February 26, 1990 will be considered by HUD.

In the matter of the project, the applicant is the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians. The Tribal Council Chairman is Delores Pigsley.
