Siletz distribution dates are October 26, 29th and 30th. These dates are late because we are expecting six food trucks to come into the warehouses anytime from the 1st to the 15th.

All persons who have previously applied for one of the new Fifteen (15) homes have been mailed another set of applications to update their files. Updated applications must be received at this office no later than November 15, 1990 to keep their files in ACTIVE status.

Anyone wishing to apply for one of the new fifteen (15) homes may receive an application through Siletz Indian Housing, Salem Area Office, Portland Area Office or Springfield Area Office.

When filling out application, read thoroughly and sign at all appropriate places. Income verification may consist of W-2 forms, Income Tax Returns or, if a change in job status was most recent, a copy of pay stubs (as many as possible) or signed letter from employer stating your pay wage and gross earning for one (1) year period.

REMEMBER....when filling out application, to read thoroughly, sign at appropriate places and send income verification. If these requirements are not met, applicant will not be considered for one of the new fifteen (15) homes.

DEATH BENEFIT INSURANCE

Due to the high number of claims this fiscal year (14), the Insurance Company has notified us that the insurance premium will increase over 250% from last fiscal year. The Tribal Council is looking at ways to continue the death benefit insurance.

Due to the extremely high cost of the insurance premium, it will be necessary to reduce the benefit from \$5000.00 to a lesser amount. That amount has yet to be determined. You will be notified of any changes to the current death benefit insurance program.
