Of the local Vets attending, several spoke a few words about their military experiences and each encouraged the students in their own way to take positive

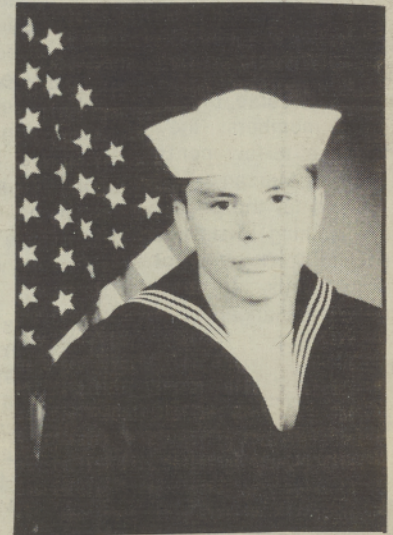
directions in their future. The pride in their community, school and students came through to the students and the audience.

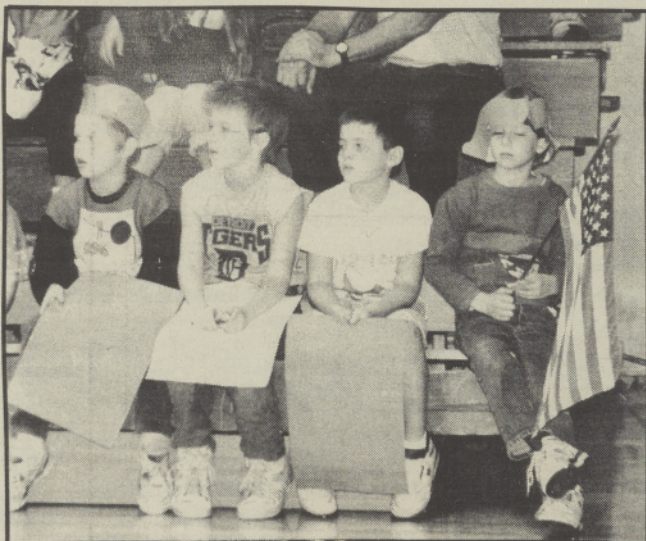
We would like to congratulate the students of Siletz School for a job well done and commend them on their patriotism.

SIGNATURE CARDS FOR TRIBAL ELECTIONS

Because of a mixup after last year's elections, the signature cards on file were destroyed. In order to comply with the Tribal Election Ordinance which allows the use of signature cards in the election process, interested tribal members must submit new signature cards. Signature cards may be requested orally or in writing from the Election Board. In completing the Signature Card the signature on the Signature Card should be the same as the name is listed on the tribal roll. If a name change occurs, for any reason (i.e., marriage, divorce, legal name change), a new signature card must be submitted. Signature cards are to be verified for accuracy of signature in one of the following methods:

- 1) Verification of signature by comparison of picture identification shown at the time of signing in from of the Election Board or Area Office staff;
- 2) Verification of signature by signing in from of an notary public; or
- 3) Verification of signature by comparison of signature in the Enrollment Department.
