Families Needed in Siletz to Participate in Study

Are you concerned with changes that are affecting the American family these days? We are. Would you like to earn \$135 and help families of the future? We are conducting a study of 150 families in Oregon with a child in grade school. We would like to invite you to participate. The Oregon Family Study, funded by a federal grant, is being done by faculty and staff in the Department of Human Development and Family Sciences at Oregon State University. Walter Kawamoto (Mayan, Tarascan) is our representative to the people of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz.

Families with one or more children (one in the 3rd, 4th or 5th Grade), and with two parents, living in the home are eligible. Our goal is to get 25 families to participate in this project. Families can be from Siletz, Salem or Springfield areas.

The study includes brief questionnaires and videotaping two family dinners and family discussions. These dinners and discussions should have both parents and two children present. This study takes about 3 to 4 hours for which participants will be paid \$135. Almost all of the video taping is done privately (3 of 4 times), by the family themselves, following instruction on how to use the video camera. All of the study is completed in your own home at your convenience.

The identity of subjects is kept confidential. All tapes and data files are labeled only with an identification number. The video tapes are viewed only for research purposes. The proposed investigation focuses on routine family behaviors.

This is an important study which could help families in the future. Your participation is needed and would be greatly appreciated.

Apply for Fall 1992 Now!

Siletz Tribal Head Start will be accepting applications for Fall 1992 classes through July 31, 1992. Priority enrollment is for low-income, tribal members and descendents of tribal members. At least ten percent of our classroom enrollment is reserved for disabled, special need children. Applications may be picked up at the classroom located at Siletz School or at any Tribal Office.

Children DO NOT have to be an enrolled Tribal member to be eligible, however, if documentation of descendency from an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian Tribe is available, we must have it on file. Openings are also available to non-Native and above income families depending upon the number of low-income, Native applications received. ALL INTERESTED FAMILIES ARE ENCOURAGED TO APPLY. HELP US SERVE THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY BE INVITING NEIGHBORS WITH 3-4 YEAR OLDS TO APPLY.

The revised 1992 family income guidelines have been announced. Priority enrollment is to families falling below the following family income guidelines.

1992 HEAD START FAMILY INCOME GUIDELINES

Family Size	Family Income Not to Exceed
1	\$ 6,810
2	9,190
3	11,570
4	13,950

Fish distribution will be taking place during the first part of June. We won't know the exact date until just a few days before it happens, those fish seem to have a mind of their own when it comes to deciding when to come up the river.

You will be required to show your Tribal I.D. card before you can receive your share of fish. I.D. cards will be required with any notes accepted. For your underage children, please bring a C.I.B. if no I.D. has been issued.

I.D. cards may be obtained from the Enrollment Department in Siletz, Oregon. Call your nearest Area Office or the Main Office in Siletz. Your first I.D. card is free. Replacement of your I.D. card is \$2.00.
