## Notice of Intent to Apply for Community Development Block Grant

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians intends to apply to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for a \$325,000 Community Development Block Grant Award.

Community Development Block Grant Funds can be used for housing rehabilitation and construction, home purchase assistance, economic development, public services, community and public facilities (water & sewer systems, street improvements, etc.)

Tribal Member's recommendations on what should be included in the Community Development Block Grant can be presented at a public meeting Monday, July 6 at 7:00 p.m. at the Siletz Tribal Community Center or by filling out and returning the form found on this page.

A copy of the Tribe's Community Development Block Grant Application will be available in each area office for Tribal Member's review beginning July 13, 1992.

## Consensus Poll for Block Grant

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is currently scheduled to submit an application/proposal for funding of the proposed FY program on or before July 31, 1992.

The present shortage of available housing on the Reservation compounded by the existing sub-standard housing conditions are areas of high priority by the CDBG Program.

The CDBG Program would very much like to poll the General Council at large on the proposed priorities currently under review. The proposed FY CDBG Program may provide for public facilities, housing rehabilitation, or economic development.
