My name is Rosemary Breon Landis and I am asking for your support as your representative on the Tribal Council.

I envision our sovereign nation as one of the prominent role models in the world. We will be strong and self-sufficient as we continue toward self-governance and economic freedom. Our tribal leaders have worked hard to provide health care, housing, social service benefits, to move toward economic independence, and to get the Tribal Court functioning.

All areas of Tribal government interest me. However, four are of special interest:

(1) **EDUCATION:** If our children acquire academic, cultural, and thinking skills at an early age, they will be equipped to continue learning all of their lives. No one can take away what they know.

(2) **OUR LANGUAGE:** Part of who we are as a people is not complete as long as we do not have our own written or spoken language. We still have time to compile and teach a form of our own language.

(3) **WHO SHOULD BE TRIBAL MEMBERS:** Services to our people are important. I realize that many want to be sure that services are extended to those on the rolls now. But from my perspective, the issue of descendency v.s. blood quantum is a matter of belonging. By "belonging", I mean that any person who is a descendant of one of our peoples who were uprooted from their homeland on the Rogue River, or anywhere in Oregon, and brought to Siletz, has the right to be considered a member of CTSI. I believe this position agrees with Purpose #1 of our Constitution...continue forever, with the help of God, our unique identity as Indians...with less than 10 full-bloods on the rolls, the time is right to restore the right to "belong" to all descendants. They "belong" whether they are legally recognized as such.

(4) **SERVICE AREAS:** Since (3/4) three-fourths of our members live outside the Siletz area, each area office needs to become a Tribal Culture Center. This would promote tourism, give our people a place to gather and possibly provide jobs.

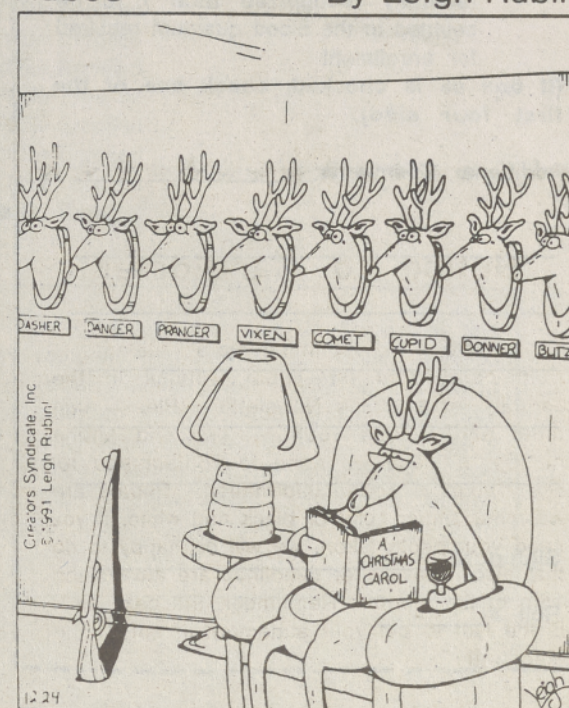
