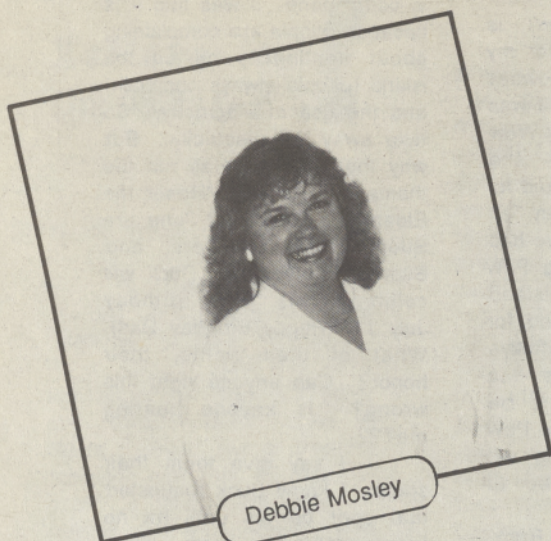
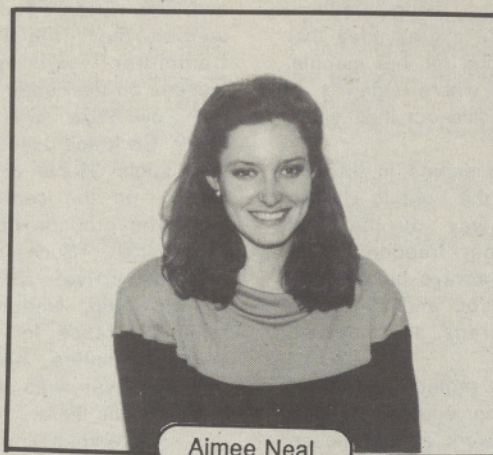


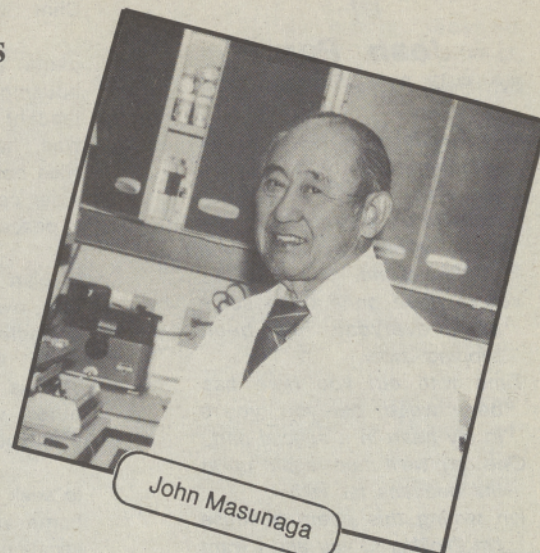
New Employees & Familiar Faces in New Places
