MOTION #5 - Anthony Martinez moved that the General Council advise the Tribal Council to request the Secretary of the Interior to authorize an election to amend the tribal constitution to affirm in writing the practice and intention of the interim in succeeding tribal council to protect the base roll.

Anthony would also like to say that he does not understand this. He don't understand the speaking of such harsh words to an elder.

Ed Ben talked about the restoration and some history of the tribe. He talked about when the roll was first established and the constitution. He also talked about what Siletz Blood really is. He stated that if we permit what the enrollment committee is trying to do in violation of the constitution, we open a cancer within our tribe that will consume us.

Pauline Rick's stated that she cannot imagine how this family has felt. It is a shame after all of the work put into the constitution, that something like this has happened. Pauline talked about peoples backgrounds and stated that we all have them, so why dig things up and cause all this turmoil.

Dee stated that the enrollment is an adhoc committee to set up a process by which we determine which documents are acceptable because we do not have that, what is acceptable as far as evidence. That is the purpose of the enrollment committee. Once those procedures would be outlined, then it would be a standing committee.

Pauline stated that only with the help of god will we overcome or we will never survive.

MOTION #6 - Aggie Pilgrim moved that all those that were sent those letters, that they will be back on the roll tomorrow. Seconded by Selene Lynch.

Amos talked about the letter that was written that got this all started. He asked if the other kids that aren't on the roll will be able to get on, because it's not fair to them. They want and need the assistance that the tribe can give them for Dental, Health, Schooling and they aren't able to get it.

There was further discussion on the blood quantum and the roll.

Gladys stated that we are not able to correct on the 54 roll, but we are able to correct after the 78 roll. She does not feel that we should bypass those that are eligible to be on the roll if the corrections were made.

Lisa Norton stated that she has been trying to stay out of this at a personal level. A lot of these people are very dear to her and being directed to this by council hurt her just as much as it did those receiving the letter. She is not here as the enrollment clerk, she is here as a general council member. Tribal Council is trying to say that they did not see the letter that went out, but they did and it was voted on by five of the council members. Up to this point not one of them has shown any negativity toward the letter and now they are all trying to turn this around. She was directed by council to do this, it was against her will, but she is a single mother and she needs her job. Lisa stated that the files are open to tribal council, but the files were not looked at, they only went by the 54 roll.

Dee personally apologized to the Martin family. She explained the situation to the Martin family. Her opinion is that if there are any changes, then they need to be notified. Council agreed on letting the family be aware of all the information with the changes and giving those that were going to be affected that chance to say "no" this is not correct. The council is continually being asked when the roll is going to be corrected.

Somebody has challenged and we have to do something. This may have been an over reaction. Nobody intended for anyone to be removed. She stated she didn't think that the Council can remove anybody.

Lisa Norton stated that the Council approved the letter.

Dee stated that they did not have the letter's that went out. They had the attachments which were: The authority from the constitution, the authority from the ordinance, how it may affect you, and the actions that those affected may need to take. There was a whole lot of discussion about the content of the letter.

Lisa asked how the letter got approved if nobody seen it? There were five people at that meeting and nobody seems to remember the letter but her.

The adhoc committee brought the issue to council and Council was a part of the investigation.

Dee stated that this was an issue that Lisa could not act on without the direction from the council.

Lillie stated that the adhoc committee was directed by council to see what happened with a tribal member appeal and that is what the adhoc committee did. She stated that the files were not gone through. They went through the 55 roll.

Tina Retasket stated that this was not an easy task for her department to deal with. Not one of them supported this. She did go with Lisa to do the research. She stated that she had asked council to wait on this due to the blood quantum surveys that have been done regarding decendancy and the blood quantum and the change that may take place with that. Tribal Council and the adhoc committee informed her that they did not want to wait on this and to go ahead with the process.

Bonnie Petersen stated that when the 54 roll was done, they counted all Indian blood.

Bobby Bayya had a concern that there was some tribal surplus stuff sold and there was no bidding through the tribe or an auction. Where did the money go? Every tribal member should of had notification of these items. Dee stated that this would be checked in to.

Lori Johnson brought up the issue of an adhoc constitution committee --- Dee stated that this will be taken out to the communities to get a response.

Katherine Harrington had a concern with the Siletz Middle School and a program that they have called the star student. There have been petitions at the store for this. She felt that they should have to spend the money and the time to transport the children to Newport to get treated with respect. Katherine is asking council to stand behind the concerned mothers of these students and stick up for our Indian children.
