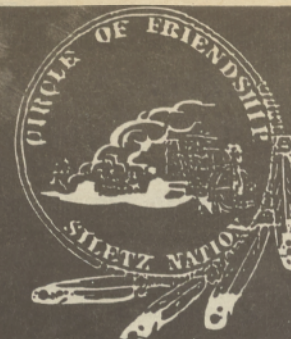

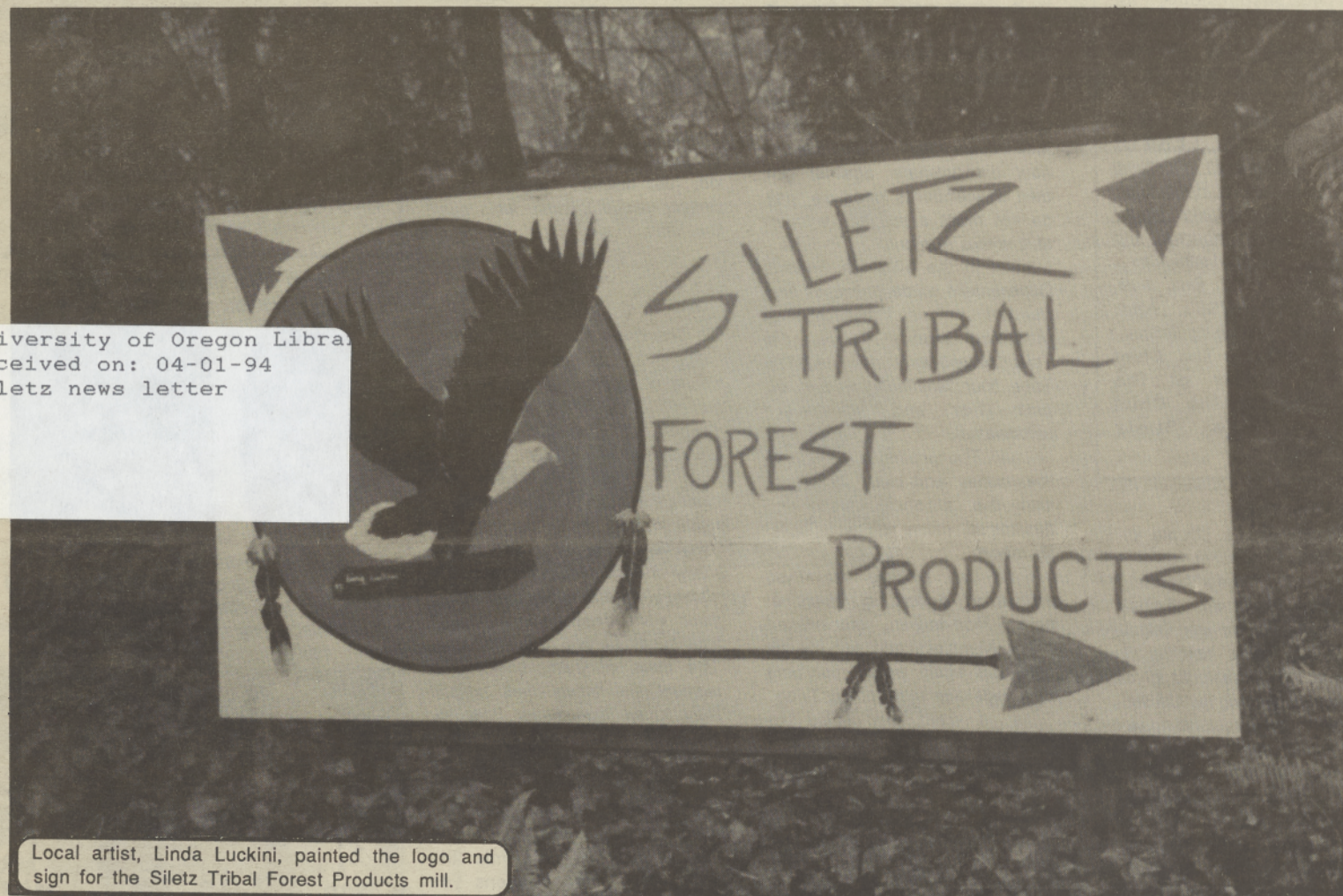

Last summer the Siletz Tribal Economic Development Commission purchased Wheeler Mill in Toledo.
