There has been a change in the Gold Creek Special Antlerless Elk Hunts this year. Instead of two Gold Creek Hunts there will be one, but there will be two permits to draw for on that hunt. Three other Antlerless Elk Hunts have been added for drawing. Those hunts are: East Stott Mtn. Z Hunt, West Stott Mtn. Z Hunt, four (4) permits for each hunt and North Alsea Z Hunt, two (2) permits.

Coast General Buck Season: September 30 through November 8, 1995.

Alsea and Stott Mtn. Controlled Hunts: October 7 thru November 8, 1995.

Coast Bull Elk Seasons:

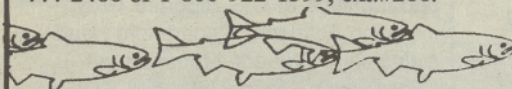
1st Season: Nov. 11 through Nov. 15, 1995
