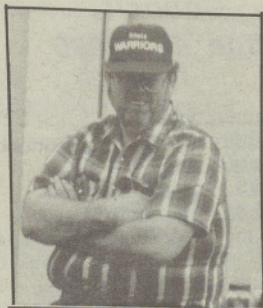
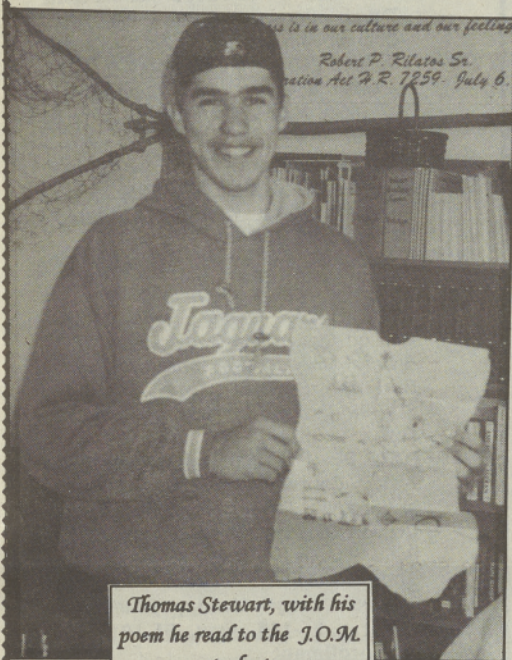


ACTIVITY DAY 1995!

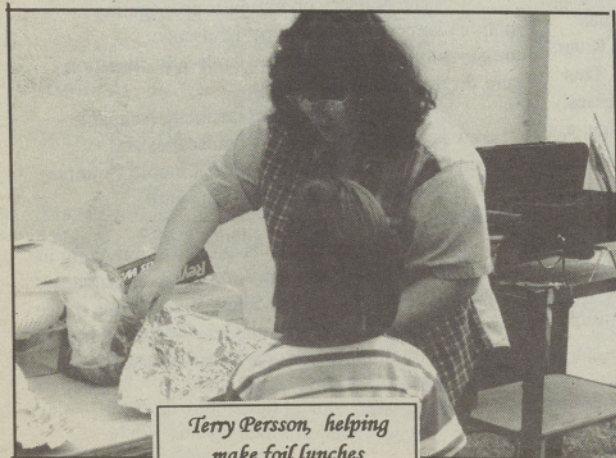

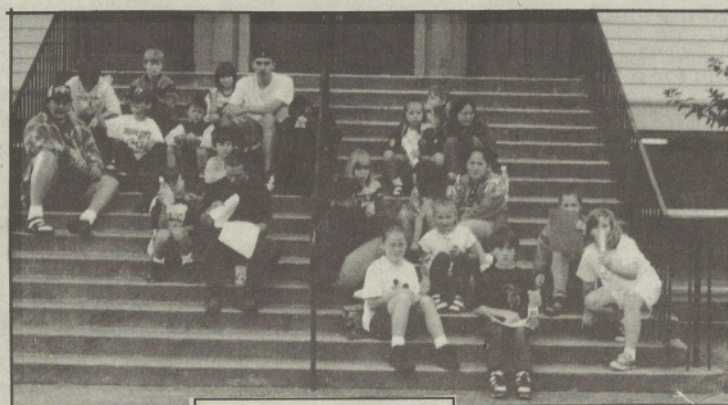
"No Names" making salad
