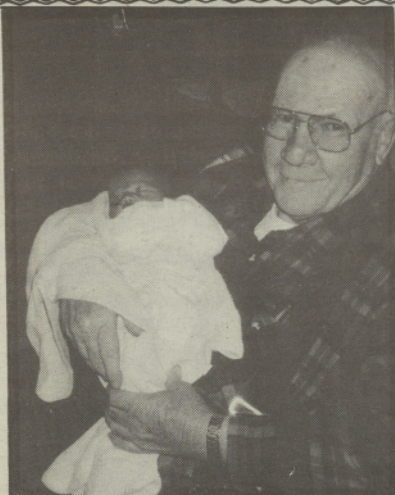




IN LOVING MEMORY George Muschamp Sr.

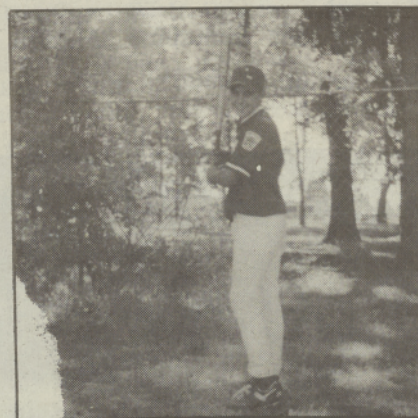
No alcohol or drugs are allowed. This is not a part of our culture, therefore individuals will be removed from the premises. No exceptions.
