POSITION: Language Project Coordinator
LOCATION: Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, Siletz, Oregon
SALARY: \$23,819 Annually
SUPERVISOR: Cultural Resources Director

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Associated Degree and 2 years experience in language preservation with experience in technical writing, native history and cultural issues, or a high school diploma/GED and 4 years experience in linguistics/language preservation, or a combination of education and experience equal to 4 years. Must possess enough knowledge of Siletz Tribal history and cultural practices & concepts to accomplish the full range of duties connected with a Siletz Tribal Language Preservation Program. Must demonstrate a serious interest in maintaining and reestablishing native language use among the Siletz people, having an inclusive attitude towards dialectic variation in documentation, curriculum development and language use, as well as in overall program activities. Have a working knowledge of the cultural, linguistic and tribal groups that the CTSI is comprised of, especially the Athapascan speaking groups. Must have the ability to relate well and communicate effectively (orally and in writing) to a wide variety of people. Must have ability and experience in writing reports and concept papers. If no grant writing experience, at least the ability to work with a grant writer, and help in the drafting of grant applications. Ability to work independently with limited supervision. Must possess a working knowledge of how to access information from a wide variety of sources, including libraries and archives. Must have the ability to operate and use audio/visual, computer and microfilm equipment. Must be willing to work weekends, and evenings on occasion. Must possess a valid Oregon State driver's license and personal transportation.

The Tribe's Indian Preference Policy will apply. Tribal government will not discriminate in selection because of race, creed, age, sex, color, national origin, physical handicap, marital status, politics, membership, nonmembership in an employee organization.
