Resolution No. 6

Whereas: A sound pension or retirement plan for Public employees of Oregon would achieve a material increase in efficiency in the Public service, and

Whereas: The League of Oregon Cities is sponsoring a sound State-wide retirement plan for all public employees of Oregon

Now Therefore Be it Resolved that the Oregon State Employees Association endorse the movement for a state-wide retirement plan as proposed by the League of Oregon Cities and commend the enactment of legislation to cover State, County and Municipal Employees under such a plan in Oregon.

Resolution No. 7
