

### JOSHUA S. SAWYER

The many friends of Joshua S. Sawyer will be grieved to learn of his death at New York City on April 6, 1947. "Josh," as he was affectionately called, will be remembered as an engineer with the Oregon State Highway Department for many years, leaving in 1929 to take a position with the Shell Oil Company in charge of their Asphalt Division at San Francisco and later in New York City. His service with the Highway Department, as well as with the Shell Oil Company, was outstanding, and reflected the integrity of character and sincerity of purpose which Josh applied to all his activities. He will always be remembered for the warmth of his friendship, the reliability of his judgment and the courage and high purpose which he invariably exercised in discharging his duties.

Last rites are at Salem. He is survived by his widow Minnie P. Sawyer, a daughter Irma Wells of Salem, and a son J. S. Sawyer who is now an engineer with the Highway Department at Lakeview.

### WOMEN EMPLOYEES IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE

Women in the United States are employed in considerable numbers in various branches of the public service, including teaching; they are found in the Federal Government, in the governments of the 48 states, and in the service of counties, municipalities, and other local units within each state.

The most recent data available for women employed in non-school government units other than Federal are for July 1943. At that time women employees totaled 384,000, or 21 percent of the 1,861,000 persons employed

by all such units. The greatest numbers and proportions of such women were employed by state governments—196,000, or 41 percent of total non-school state employees. Counties have the next highest proportion of women employees, who constituted 28 percent of a total of 329,000 employees. Cities, towns, villages and townships employed 96,000 women out of a total of 1,051,000.
