Plans for Cooperatives or Discount Purchases

Mr. Morelock said that as a long range program the organization would not continue to exist unless it is made a cooperative. He said eventually things would settle down and the problems cried about would be so greatly aggravated that in comparison now would seem pale. When there are no issues, it will be selfish interest and the organization will exist only for that.

Mr. O'Neil mentioned that Mr. E. H. Clymer, former director of public relations, had said he would like to work up a scheme on a cooperative basis. Mr. O'Neil said he would go on record as being in favor of asking Mr. Clymer if he would like to give some of his time to such activities.

President White presented a communication from the State Tire Service on a group purchase plan and the secretary read the letter.

Mr. O'Neil said he believed that in order for any member to be in a position to avail himself of this plan he should be fully paid up for one year.

Mr. Morelock said that if the state should decide it cannot increase wages, it might be suggested that it lend facilities for purchasing in lieu of such increase.

Mr. Chidsey moved that the president of the Association or someone he might appoint approach Eddy Clymer and ask him if he would get to work on this. It might be necessary to appoint some member to help Mr. Clymer. Mr. Chidsey said he knew Mr. Clymer had a lot of good ideas and that if the Association gave him the word he would go ahead and get some action. Motion carried.

At President White's suggestion it was decided to turn over to Mr. Clymer the letter from the State Tire Service.

Other Matters Discussed

Mr. R. M. Smith suggested a drive for 5000 new members by July 1.

Mr. Morelock asked if there was any hope on the salary question to be reported by the members of the board to the members of their districts.

President White said very definitely there is hope, but that nothing definite could be expected before the first of the year. He said the first round had been lost but that there might be 15
