

EDUCATION FOR ADULTS INCREASES IN OREGON

The tendency to consider one's education completed when he finishes school is disappearing. In every part of the country the interest in continuing education for adults is increasing rapidly. In Oregon it is the general extension division which is charged with providing as wide an offering in adult education as may be possible on a state-wide basis. Through extension centers at Portland and Vanport, in classes in nearly 40 other towns and communities in the state, and by means of correspondence courses, the opportunities are offered.

From a total enrollment of 4800 in 1942-43, total enrollments increased to 13,720 in 1946-47 (nearly three times as many). But it is not only in formal classes and correspondence courses that the increase in service has been noted. The popularity of the farm and home programs of radio station KOAC is increasing and a larger proportion of the citizens of Oregon are listening to these programs. The School of the Air has more listeners than ever before. Visual instruction is more important since the war, and in clubs and granges and other groups, as well as in school rooms, the use of visual aids has increased tremendously.

Institutes of International Relations have been held in many parts of the state, providing forums and lectures on matters of immediate concern in

the relations of our nation with the U. N. and with other countries.

Oregon's Extension Division, representing all of the resources of the state system of higher education, is better organized this year than ever before to meet the needs of the great state which it serves. Additional staff makes possible a more complete coverage of the state, from Brookings to Milton-Freewater, and from Astoria to Ontario. Every effort is being made to meet all of the requests that come in and to
