

should be made for space in which the employees could meet in the structure itself, some place open to all employees and where the chapters could hold their meetings.

#### Date for General Council Meeting

Mr. White asked what the pleasure of the officers was in regard to the date for the council meeting to be held in Portland, stating that inasmuch as it was just prior to a legislative session the meeting should be a three-day session. The meeting must be held during the month of November.

Mr. Morelock said it would seem appropriate to delegate the selection of the date to someone who would take it up with the Portland people and give them a chance to do a little spade work and make reports as to place and so forth.

Mr. White suggested appointment of a committee and Mr. McCroskie moved that a committee be appointed to work with the Portland chapters to settle date and place for the next Council meeting. Motion seconded.

An amendment was proposed to the effect that the President and Executive Secretary be appointed and that they send out notices after the meeting place is decided upon and the dates set. Amendment carried. Motion carried.

Mr. French asked if he was to return to Portland and get the chapters together about the meeting, or if it would be taken care of here.

Mr. White said that he and Mr. Stewart would follow through and find out what dates could be available for the Portland meeting.

#### Other Business

Another item under new business was the request for a charter from Mercury Chapter No. 39, Oregon State Board of Health, which had been formed with 47 charter members. The request was approved by all officers of the Association.

Miss Brimacombe asked what disposal should be made with a check in the amount of \$50.00 which had been received over two years ago from the Crater Lake Chapter to be used to help defray the expense of an assistant to the Executive Secretary. The check previously was returned to the Chapter, which in turn sent it back to the Association with the request that it be held in the files. The check is now outlawed. Mr. O'Neil moved that the check be returned to the Crater Lake Chapter with the thanks of the Association and the request that they keep it in their files. The secretary was so instructed.

Mr. White asked what was to be done about the request of Judge Charles Red-

ding for someone to represent the Association on the Community Chest in Portland this fall. Mr. White said he believed Mr. French, District Director, should serve in that capacity, and as Mr. French said he would accept, Mr. White appointed Allen French to represent the State Employees Association on the Portland Community Chest Drive.

Mr. R. M. Smith suggested the names of all honorary members be placed in the magazine. There was discussion as to whether membership continued when the recipient no longer held office. Mr. Smith then moved that a list of those who had accepted honorary membership be published in the magazine and the motion carried.

Mr. Query said he wondered if the traffic and parking problem around the State Office Building should come before the Board of Directors or before the Salem Chapters. It was decided to let such local matters be handled through local chapter recommendations.
