

R 2, Rose City Chapter No. 5. That the State allow credit for all prior service. (Adopted by General Council).

R 3, Rose City Chapter No. 5, combined with R 14, Corvallis Chapter No. 29 and R 17, Salem Chapter No. 1. (See R 17 below).

R 4, Klamath Falls Chapter No. 12, (a) Making retirement compulsory at age 65. Did not pass. (b) Increasing the amount of prior service payments. Combined with another resolution. (c) Retaining the present limit of 20 years for prior service payments. Did not pass.

R 5, Rose City Chapter No. 5. Retirement on a living wage. Committee recommended that this resolution be referred to the Board of Directors for such action as they saw fit. (Committee recommendation approved by Council).

R 6, Rose City Chapter No. 5. BE IT RESOLVED, To amend by Legislative Action, Section 20, Chapter 401, Laws of 1945, as amended by striking out or deleting portions of this Section as are included between brackets ().

"Section 20, Until the first payment on account of his service retirement allowance becomes normally due, a person who is a member of the system may elect to convert (the annuity portion of) the allowance otherwise payable on his account after his retirement into a service retirement annuity of equivalent actuarial value of one of the optional forms named below."

Committee's recommendation was do pass. (Committee recommendation approved by Council).

R 7, Rose City Chapter No. 5. Increasing employer contributions. Committee combines this with another resolution which covered this point, with the consent of Rose City delegate.

R 8, Rose City Chapter No. 5. Re: All State matching funds in Retirement Fund. Committee recommended that it do not pass. Mr. Morelock moved such action on the grounds largely that the bookkeeping involved would be greater expense than a benefit. (Committee recommendation adopted).

R 9, Rose City Chapter No. 5. Providing for minimum living wage for

disability retirement. Committee recommended that it do not pass based on the grounds that this resolution as submitted did not furnish anything for the committee to act upon. It was a debatable item. (Committee recommendation adopted by General Council).

R 10, Rose City Chapter No. 5. Increases in retirement allowances to be studied and report made to next General Council. (Adopted by General Council).

R 11, Eugene Chapter No. 6 and R 12, Roundup Chapter No. 24 and R 13, Tillamook Chapter No. 15.

Committee substitution, to-wit: "(a) That the 1948 General Council go on record as approving the policy of leaving the retirement age as in the present statute, but that we not oppose the change of retirement ages for those groups not covered by this Association or where the present ages of retirement are definitely in conflict to the best interests of the State service." (Adopted by General Council).

"(b) That the problem of arbitrary retirement of academic members of the State System of Higher Education at age of 65 be referred to the Board of Directors for study and that the Directors be authorized to seek such corrective amendments to the Public Employees Retirement Act as seem appropriate after such consideration but not to raise the minimum retirement age above 68." (Adopted by General Council).

R 14, Corvallis Chapter No. 29.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that this Association seek to have the state legislature adopt the provisions of the following proposed amendments to the Public Employees Retirement Act:

(1) The maximum salary limit as basis for matching the employees' contributions toward the retirement fund by the public employer be increased from \$200 per month as provided in the present law to \$350 per month. (Section 15, Paragraph 1). (See R 17 below).

(2) That prior service credit pension be increased from \$2.50 per month to \$4.00 per month, and that this

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
