Jobs With a Future Unlimited; Civil Service Positions Inviting To Young People

Career opportunities with the state government of Oregon are open to trained men and women in interesting and varied fields, including Engineering, Business Accounting, Personnel, Social Work, Science, and Education. Those positions open to college trained people are, in most cases, of the trainee level in a department where promotion to more responsible positions of public service is virtually assured to industrious competent personnel.

Appointments are made at the minimum of an established salary range for the position. At the completion of six months satisfactory service, a salary increase normally is granted and succeeding annual increases are based on individual employee merit.

Two weeks paid vacation each year, sick leave that accumulates at the rate of one day per month, ten holidays each year, a five-day week, a generous retirement system and job security superior to that found in most private employment are some of the advantages of state service. In addition employees have open to them membership in employee's unions, a hospitalization plan and a credit union.

In certain classes, examinations are being given and persons successfully completing the examination become

eligible in rank order for appointment. Examinations may be written or un-assembled. The latter consists only of an evaluation of experience and training.

In other classes an examination is not being given at this time. Departments make direct appointments to these positions.

For all positions, interested applicants should submit to the Civil Service Commission an application for employment. (CS 100) If there is an examination for the position for which you are making application you will be notified regarding the time and place. If no examination is being given, your application will be referred directly to the department where a vacancy exists or is anticipated.

The state of Oregon offers employment in sub professional and professional engineering positions in many fields. The Oregon State Highway department, Board of Aeronautics, Fish Commission, Game Commission, Engineers, and Board of Health offer a variety of positions in office engineering, hydraulics, construction, drafting, sanitation, aeronautical, etc. All positions are in the state of Oregon.
