

by adding a comma after the word legislation appearing in the 4th line of said paragraph, and in turn adding the words "OR ANYONE," * * * Thence, said amendment is intended that paragraph 9 will read "In so far as action by this Association is compatible with the best interest of the people of the State of Oregon, to sponsor and support legislation beneficial to state employees, and to oppose legislation, or anyone, detrimental to their interests, and to promote and protect the welfare of the membership of the Association." (Failed to pass).

CA 4, Columbia Chapter No. 34, RESOLVED, that an amendment to Article II, Objects, paragraph 5, of the Constitution of the Oregon State Employees Association be made by striking out the period ending the sentence which composes all of said paragraph 5, and in turn using a comma followed by the words "AND/OR ITS EMPLOYEES." Thence, said amendment is intended that paragraph 5 will read * * * "To unite the employees of the State of Oregon for the purpose of exerting an effective influence with respect to matters concerning employees which are compatible with the best interests of state government, and/or its employees." (Failed to pass).
