

Places to Go And Things to See

We are indebted to the Travel Information Department of the Oregon State Highway Commission for the following data regarding coming events in Oregon which we hope will be found interesting to the members and others. We quote from their press release as follows:

"Nearly 150 entertainment events ranging from festivals and beauty pageants to round-ups and fishing derbies are scheduled during Oregon's 1949 tourist season, the Oregon state highway commission travel information department reported this week.

"Through cooperation of chambers of commerce and kindred groups, events have been listed for every section of the state. The list was carefully checked for accuracy, but dates are subject to change after release.

"Oregonians and out-of-state visitors have a wide choice of attractions from which to supplement sight-seeing in Oregon's cool green playlands from the seashore to eastern Oregon and from the Columbia river to the California state line.

"A major centennial, to be observed during the year, celebrates 100 years of progress at Forest Grove for the Pacific University. A number of special events are planned during the year, climaxed by a September pageant.

"The Pendleton Round-Up, regarded as a national institution, this year will present its thrilling program from August 24 to 27, a departure from its former dates during September. Other round-ups and rodeos, especially over the 4th of July holidays, are on the list throughout the summer and fall.

The Beaver State will play tribute to the beauty of its young women at the Miss Oregon pageant at Seaside July 22-24. The winner will represent Oregon at the Miss America pageant in Atlantic City.

Oregon, too, will pay honor to her strawberries, cherries, pears, flax, sugar beets, potatoes, beans, cranberries, fish, gold, wildflowers, and timber by

holding festivals and carnivals throughout the summer and fall.

"Ashland will again present Shakespearean plays in the nation's only Elizabethan theatre in August, including such classics as Othello, Richard II, Romeo and Juliet and others.

"Products of the state will be featured at the Oregon state fair beginning on Labor Day and cattle will come into their own during the Pacific International Livestock Show at Portland in October.
