Mr. Boldt moved that it be the policy of the Board that the resolutions be in by October 1st. Motion carried.

Item 14. Resolution received from Salem Chapter No. 1. Re: Increasing Civil Service Budget and Publicity. Mr. O'Neil commented that the matters required not much action except to continue the thinking we are now doing and intend to do. No new subject matter. He moved the matter be tabled. Motion carried.

Item 15. Committee to survey such in-service training programs as exist, etc. Mr. White appointed the following committee: R. M. Smith, Chairman, P. M. Brandt and Ruth Jaynes. The committee is to report to the 1949 General Council.

Item 16. Conduct of loyalty test. Mr. Query moved it be tabled. Mr. Leo Smith stated that when the bill came up he reviewed the law and there were two separate thoughts: One portion to prohibit employment of persons who advocate the overthrow of the government by force and the second portion which required a loyalty test. All legislators agreed that they couldn't go

for the loyalty test. It was believed that neither a state administrator nor the legislature has a right to conduct a loyalty test. Motion carried.

Mr. O'Neil moved it be referred to the Civil Service Director for report back to the Board. Motion carried.
