How much each veteran will receive as a dividend payment is anybody's guess, because it depends on how long he carried his GI insurance, the amount he carried, age at which he took out the policy, and the number of deaths occurring in his own age group. The VA won't even attempt to say how much, but the experts have figured that the average payment will be in the neighborhood of \$175.

There is no deadline for applying. However, the VA expects to start paying out next January and to complete the bulk of payments the following June, so it is presumed that most veterans will have applied by the end of 1949. The application forms are simple to fill out, consisting primarily of questions which seek to identify each veteran through his service serial number and his insurance number, and to find his present address. However, service officers or the state veterans' agency will gladly assist those who have difficulty completing the forms.

Incidentally, veterans also should know that they can still reinstate their lapsed term insurance simply by passing a physical exam and paying the price of two monthly premiums.
