

CS 8 Public Welfare No. 31

That the Civil Service Commission be requested to revise Rule 15, Sections 2 and 3 regarding dismissals and suspensions in order to give more adequate protection to the employee. (Adopted.)

After a short recess the credentials committee reported and introduced W. P. Laws of Chapter No. 10 at Coquille, E. F. Vincent of Success Chapter No. 30, Ed Lindburg of the Tax Commission, Chapter No. 18, and Bert Simpson of Salem Chapter No. 1.

The report of the nominating committee was read and placed on file.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS:

WM 1 La Grande Chapter No. 4

That an annual financial statement of the Public Employees Retirement Fund be published in the Oregon State Employees magazine. (Adopted.)

WM 2 The Dalles Chapter No. 9

That the general council take steps to blanket bond all chapter secretaries, treasurers and secretary-treasurers. (Rejected.)

WM 3 Salem Chapter No. 1

The position of a full-time legal counsel be eliminated and that the board of directors be directed to engage legal services from time to time and only as required. (Rejected by the general council, because the board of directors is charged by the constitution with this responsibility.)

WM 4 Salem Chapter No. 1

That the policy of OSEA public relations shall include the following objectives: to improve public good will towards the OSEA and state employees by direct appeal to the public, by advertised support of worthwhile community and state activities, by prepared press releases for chapter use and by other proved methods advantageous to the OSEA. (Adopted.)

WM 5 Roseburg Chapter No. 2

An informative news letter supplementing the bulletins be issued. Such letter should state, in some detail, the activities of our Salem staff. (Adopted.)

WM 6 Marion Chapter No. 18

Commending the OSEA officers, directors and staff pledging support. (Adopted.)

Report of the budget was read and the committee recommended adoption. A motion was made that it be adopted and it carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p. m. until after the football game.

The meeting was called to order at 4:20 p. m. by President Loren White.

L. A. McCoskrie, chairman of the hospital insurance committee, reported. He stated the committee was formed because of complaints coming from employees who were dissatisfied with services received from OPS. Doctors and hospitals are becoming dissatisfied because they do not receive full compensation for their services. So far no contracts submitted by insurance companies fit into a plan whereby the association will receive any benefits. Any one of the plans can be bought by an individual which results in a great many payroll deductions to the various companies, of which there are already five. The committee recommended that a contract be drawn by someone familiar in that line and it be presented to some company or group of companies to underwrite. It was moved that the report be adopted and the motion carried.
