WC 10 Columbia Chapter No. 34

That all state employees be paid on a semi-monthly basis, comparable to present state law for industry. (Rejected.)

WC 11 Columbia Chapter No. 34

That all state employees qualified to receive expense account monies, be paid in advance, when the amount exceeds \$50.00. (Rejected.)

WC 14 Baker Chapter No. 37

That district maintenance office clerks (2 and 4) be put back on 44-hour week with corresponding raise in pay. (Referred to board of directors for action as they see fit.)

WC 15 Rose City No. 5

That all employees reporting for work at a specified time and who are sent home with instructions to report for work at a later time be allowed two hours time to compensate them for their inconvenience. (Referred to board of directors for study and action as they see fit.)

WC Rose City No. 5

That all state employees who are members of the retirement system be placed on a monthly salary. (Rejected.)

WC 19 Public Welfare No. 31

That employees earn $\frac{1}{4}$ day additional vacation for each five years of service, including past service. (Adopted.)

WC 20 Public Welfare No. 31

That a regular pay day be established by all state departments. (Adopted.)

REPORT OF RETIREMENT COMMITTEE:

R 1 Astoria Chapter No. 8

Full credit for all prior service. (Adopted.)

R 2 Salem Chapter No. 1

That the present established retirement ages be not reduced, and that full prior service be allowed. (Adopted.)

R 3 Klamath Falls Chapter No. 12

That prior service pay be increased from the present rate of \$2.50 per month per year service, to \$4.00 per month, per year service. (Adopted.)

R 6 Bend Chapter No. 3; R 7 Astoria Chapter No. 8; R 8 Columbia Chapter No. 34

Some feasible plan be worked out whereby an employee could retire at the end of 30 years service. (Adopted in principle and referred to board of directors.)

R 9 Bend Chapter No. 3

That the state match the employee's contribution at the time the contribution is made, that the state be permitted to withdraw its contribution at the time the employee withdraws his. (Rejected.)

R 10 Bend Chapter No. 3

That an employee may withdraw his contributions at any time prior to retirement upon terminating his employment. (Rejected.)

R 11 La Grande Chapter No. 4

The state's contribution should be 60 per cent and that the employee's portion should be 40 per cent. (Rejected.)

R 12 Salem Chapter No. 1;

R 13 La Grande No. 4

The investment field investigated and that the retirement fund be invested in a wider field and more remunerative field

than is now permissible. (Referred to board of directors.)

R 14 O.V.S. Chapter No. 36

That any employee whose position is covered by the Public Employees Retirement Act, shall be entitled to prior service credit, whether retirement contributions began in place of prior service or other covered employment, provided employee was not absent from covered service more than the statutory time allowed by law. (Rejected.)

R 15 SIAC Chapter No. 20

Amend the retirement law to provide the beneficiary with a monthly annuity equivalent to the maximum that can be purchased by the amounts contributed by the employee plus an equal amount to be contributed by the employer, providing the employee has served not less than 10 years and before retirement. (Adopted.)

R 17 Corvallis Chapter No. 29

The employer match the employees' contribution on a salary not to exceed \$4200 annually. (Adopted.)

R 18 Rose City Chapter No. 5;

R 16 Columbia No. 34

Compare Oregon retirement law to those of other states and private agencies, make tentative revisions and submit to 1950 general council. (Adopted.)

R 19 Public Welfare No. 31

That no employee be retired on less than \$50 per month. (Rejected.)
