

Veterans Activities

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World War II veterans aspiring to own homesteads may be interested in two current projects being opened by the Bureau of Reclamation to public entry. One is the Yakima homestead project in south central Washington, where eleven farm units will go to successful applicants to be determined at a future date by a public drawing. First chance goes to World War II veterans, who have a 90-day preference period—deadline is July 19—to apply.

The Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs will have a supply of application forms, or they may be obtained by writing to the Superintendent, Yakima Project, Bureau of Reclamation, Federal B'dg., Yakima, Wash.

To be eligible, the veteran must have two years of farming experience behind him, not less than \$3500 in cash, assets or livestock or farm equipment, character and ability references, and must intend to farm as an occupation.

The other homestead opening, which probably will have been announced by the time this goes to press, is in the Riverton reclamation project near Riverton, Wyoming. Fifty farm units will be opened there, with World War II veterans getting the usual 90-day preference period in which to file.

Applications will be available either from the Oregon Veterans' Department, or from the Bureau of Reclamation, P. O. Box 2130, Billings, Mont.
