Boardman Retires

Recent reports that Sam H. Boardman would retire as superintendent of state parks under the state highway commission have now been confirmed. The commission has announced his retirement to become effective July 1, this year.

Boardman first entered the employ of the state as resident engineer of the Boardman, Eastern Oregon district, in 1919, and continued in an engineering capacity until 1929, when he became head of the state parks division. Since his latter appointment he has made

his headquarters in Salem. He is 75 years of age and is enjoying fairly good health.

When Boardman was appointed to his present position there were only a few small state parks in Oregon which were under jurisdiction of district highway department engineers.

State Parks Outstanding

Under Boardman's guidance the Oregon state natural park system has become outstanding in the United States.

Officials recall that Boardman was taken off an oiling job on the Crater
