months. Reasons for the increased requests appears to be: (1) the difficulty of finding other jobs after termination, (2) a tighter budget situation causing departments to release below standard employees, and (3) a lower rate of voluntary resignations.

Letters have been written to other public jurisdictions requesting pay information and letters have been sent to various employee organizations asking for their recommendations and also to the department heads for their suggestions.
