OSEA to FLOAT 14,000 SHARES of PREFERRED STOCK Brisk Buying Expected

At 8:00 a.m. Thursday, March 1st, the OREGON STATE EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION will float 14,000 shares of stock. Par value will be \$6.00 per share.

Investors are expected to make early purchases because in the past this corporation has declared remarkable dividends.

FIRST QUARTER DIVIDEND:

Three full-time representatives working throughout the state for state employees.
