CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS

CONSTITUTION
ARTICLE I (Constitution)

Name and Objects

The Oregon State Employees Association is hereby constituted and established in order to foster acquaintanceship, cooperation, efficiency and harmony among State employees and to develop a fuller knowledge among them of the State's organization, functions and activities; to encourage and preserve a true merit system in State government; to promote the welfare of State employees in all ways compatible with the public interest, including the support of legislation deemed beneficial and resistance to legislation deemed detrimental to their interests; to encourage the maintenance of highest standards of employee-conduct in governmental affairs; to advocate and defend a just and efficacious administration of laws, to aid in the improvement of government and in the development of the state's resources and the advancement of the State's economy; to inspire and maintain in

the hearts of its membership a constant dedication to the principles of constitutional democracy as exemplified in our American form of government; and in all ways to render the most effective service to the people of the United States of America and of the State of Oregon.

ARTICLE II (Constitution)

Location of Principal Office

The principal office of this Association is in Salem, Oregon.

ARTICLE III (Constitution)

Classes of Membership

Section 1. The Association has only two mutually exclusive classes of membership; active and associate.

Section 2. An active member is (a) any employee of the State of Oregon not elected by the people nor appointed directly by the Governor, or (b) any person on retirement from State employ, whose dues, in each case, are not delinquent.

Section 3. An associate member is any person who while an active member, (a) retires or is granted military leave of absence from State service,

or separates from State service, but retains membership in the State Employees Retirement System, and who requests and receives chapter credentials of associate membership, and (b) any person who separates from State service while an active member and whose name is on a State Civil Service layoff list and who has paid his dues.

ARTICLE IV (Constitution)
The Chapter

Section 1. The basic membership group is the chapter. Each chapter shall maintain an active membership of not less than twenty.

Section 2. A chapter is defined as a self-governing organization of state employees, which functions as a lawful part of the State Association.

Section 3. Twenty or more persons eligible for active membership in the State Association may submit a formal resolution adopting the constitution of the State Association and petitioning for a charter.

Section 4. A chapter shall be established upon the approval and the issuance of such charter by the board of directors of the State Association.

Section 5. After the filing of a petition for a charter as provided in Section 3, of this Article, and prior to the issuance of such charter, the board of directors may authorize the group petitioning for a charter to organize with such rights and duties of a chapter as may be approved by the board of directors.

Section 6. When a petition is made to establish a new chapter in an area

served by two or more existing chapters, such chapters shall first be notified and given an opportunity to be heard by the board of directors.

Section 7. The chapter that first selects a particular name shall have prior rights thereto. The same name shall not be used by two chapters.

Section 8. A new chapter, when notified that a charter has been granted and a name assigned thereto by the board of directors, shall pay its dues to the State Association.

Section 9. The charter of any chapter may, for good cause, be revoked by a three-fourths vote of the board of directors. Revocation of a charter must be ratified by a three-fourths vote of the delegates at the succeeding General Council.

Section 10. A charter signed by the president and secretary-treasurer shall be issued under the seal of the State Association.

Section 11. A charter shall not enforce an arbitrary numerical or other limitation on its active membership.

Section 12. A chapter shall provide for its self-government, in so far as the same is not in conflict with the constitution and by-laws of the State Association. It shall file with the State Association a duly authenticated copy of its constitution and by-laws and all amendments thereto when adopted.

Section 13. A chapter upon becoming inactive for any reason shall deposit all unobligated monies in the treasury of the State Association. If after a period of five years the chap-

New Highway Engineer
W. C. Williams, Long
Time Member of OSEA

In a statement to The SENTINEL, W. C. Williams, newly appointed chief engineer of the Highway Department, expressed a genuine interest in the stat Association. A longtime member of OSEA, he said that he has always had the intrests of the organization at heart and that he is looking forward to continued affiliation.

Succeeding R. H. Baldock who retired August 16 to head a highway mission in Iraq, W. C. (Dutch) Williams has his roots firmly planted in Oregon soil. A Polk County native, he started work for the Highway Commission in 1920 as a transitman. For the past nine years prior to his appointment as highway engineer, he was chief deputy under Baldock. As division and construction engineer, Williams has served in many parts of Oregon, including La Grande and Portland.

He was born at Independence on his family's donation land claim, studied at Oregon State College and later completed his engineering course. His first job was on the survey crew that chose the route for the Valley & Siletz Railroad between 1914 and 1917.

Williams served in the 41st division in World War II and saw overseas duty.

Recently he headed the committee of the Western Association of State Highway Officials that conducted tests in Southern Idaho to determine the effect of trucks on highways.

Also a member of OSEA Salem Chapter One is Forrest Cooper who succeeded Williams.

Chemical Changes in Milk
Due for 3-Year Study

Oregon State College is one of the three colleges to participate in studies of the changes in the chemical composition of milk. These studies, it is announced by P. M. Brandt, head of the Dairying Department of OSC, are particularly with reference to changes in protein and other solids not fat.

Also studied are various manufacturing processes such as milk powder, cheese and cottage cheese. Storage and temperature effects upon milk and dairy products likewise are subjects under observation by the Dairy Products Marketing Association. The organization is comprised of cooperative groups. Ames, Cornell and Oregon State Colleges have been selected to conduct the studies for which the DPMA has given a grant of \$5,000 a year for three years.

Associated with P. M. Brandt in the manufacturing processes studies are Professor Roy Stein and Dr. G. A. Richardson. The latter OSC men are members of Oregon State Faculty Chapter 72. P. M. Brandt belongs to Corvallis 29.

Brandt spent a week in July in the Washington, D.C., office of the DPMA, returning July 22.

ARTICLE V (Constitution)
The District

Section 1. For administrative and representative purposes the State is divided into districts, not more than ten in number, each defined geographically and each composed of several chapters, and each represented by a District Director who must have and maintain membership in a chapter in the district.

Section 2. A chapter may be assigned to only one district.

Section 3. Districts may be redefined and new districts formed by the Board of Directors, subject to confirmation by a two-thirds vote of the General Council.

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
