Word was received, just prior to going to press, that Roy Taylor, vice-president of Salem Chapter No. 1 and active in the promotion of Association objectives, has been appointed Personnel Director of the Oregon State Correctional Institution, effective April 14.

Roy was formerly a Personnel Technician in the Personnel Division of the State Highway Department where he has been employed since June, 1956. He is well-known to many OSEA members, having served as a Field Representative in the Headquarters office for over a year prior to his joining state service.

In a personal interview, Roy said, "The promotion marks an important step in my career and is a real challenge which I accept with gratefulness." 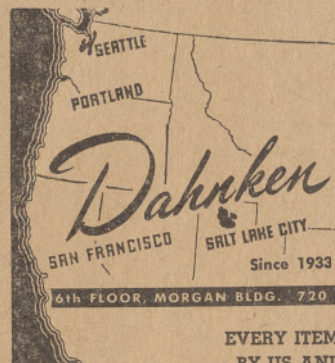
