LEGISLATIVE POLL SHOWS SOLONS AGAINST "SUBSTANTIAL" EMPLOYEE WAGE INCREASE

A recent United Press International poll of the 1963 Legislature revealed that a "substantial increase" in the salaries of state employees was not favored. However, many of those answering the questionnaire, which covered a number of items coming before the '63 Legislature, said that they favored a reasonable increase. Some made a point of OSEA's "competitive pay" idea, saying that they were in favor of this to the extent allowed by funds.

All of which brings us to the matter

of income and expenditures, or whether or not increased state services can be afforded with a deficit staring the taxpayer in the face.

The state employee is a reasonable person. Certainly, no one knows better than he the need for economy. It is likely that he, as a taxpayer, is as much in favor of economy in government as the other white and blue collar workers in Oregon. However, this economy may take part of his proposed pay adjustment. It's a dilemma faced by most of the 20,000 classified and unclassified

state employees this winter and spring.

The question may boil down to a point of maintaining present services or adding new ones. If this is the case, there is a possibility that competitive pay for current services will be approached. There is also the possibility that educational requests will be greatly modified. In fact, there are many possibilities being put forward as this is written.

Whatever the decision of the Legislature, OSEA members will, as in past years, be kept informed through weekly publication of the Legislative Bulletin.
