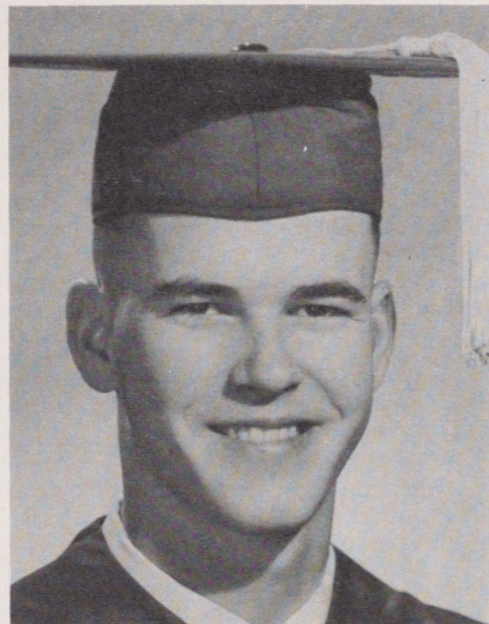
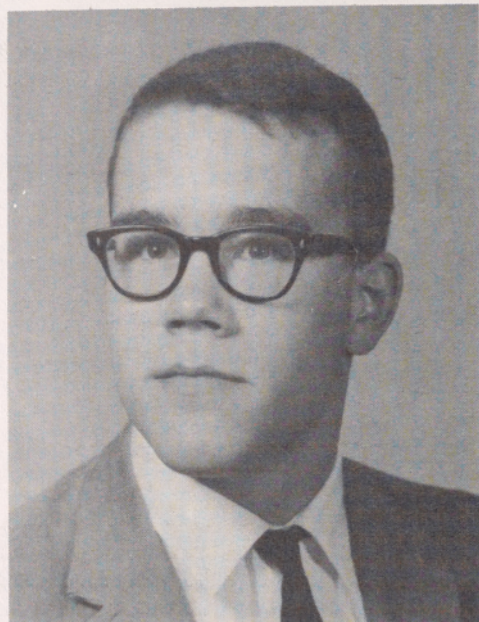

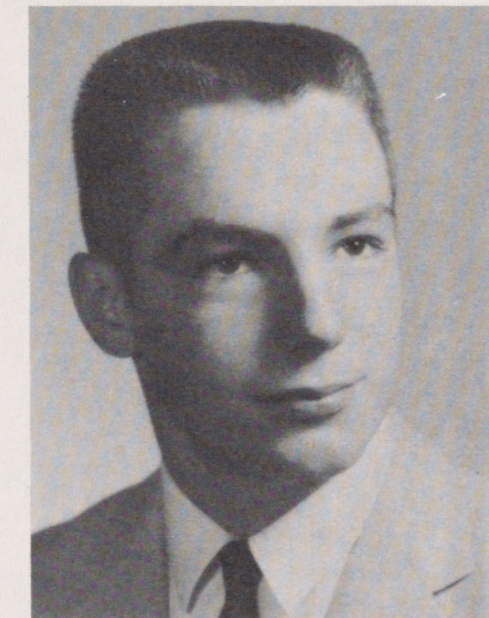

CASSIE FAY PARTRIDGE

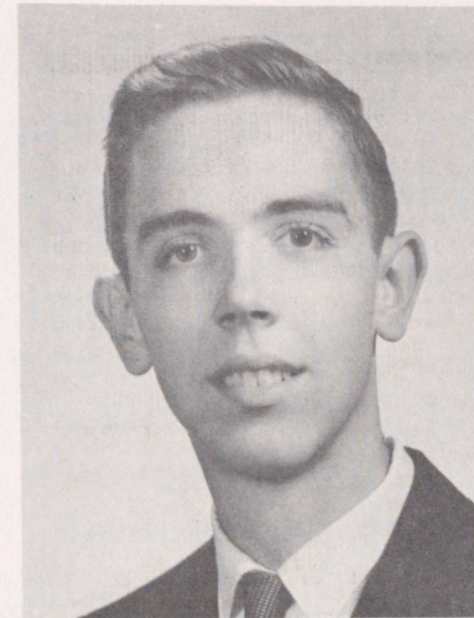

PATRICK E. IRISH

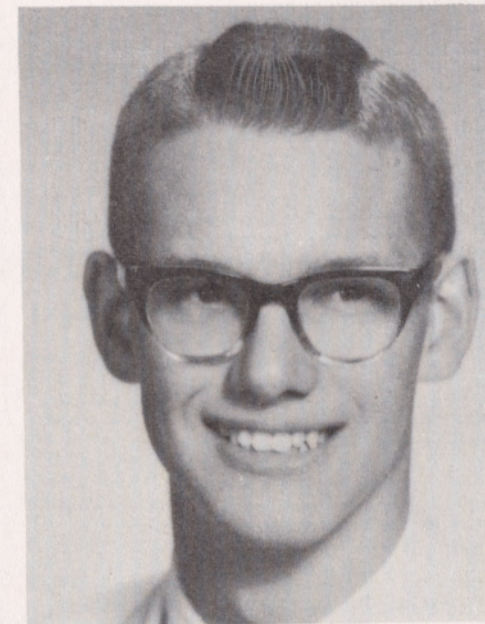

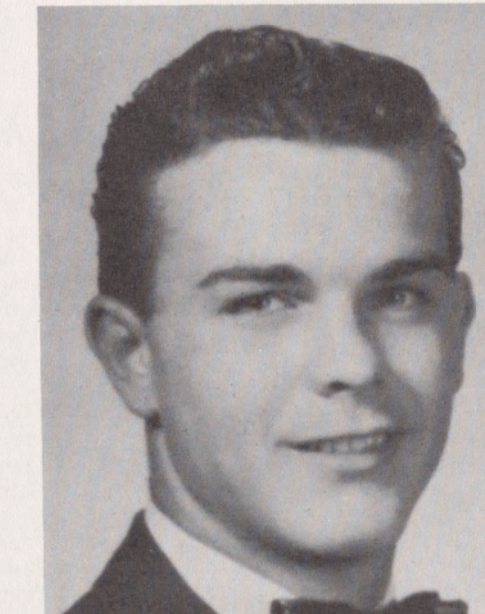
