LANE CO. STATE EMPLOYEES DONATE \$245 TO HOSPITAL

The state employees of Lane County, under the sponsorship of the Oregon State Employees Association, presented a check for \$245 to the Children's Hospital School in Eugene at a ceremony held June 8. The money will be used to purchase a tiny tot wheelchair and a clinical walker.

Helen Towne, Director of District No. 6, presented the money to Byron D. Krog, Managing Director of the Children's Hospital School.

All five of the OSEA chapters which participated in the community service program fund raising drive were represented at the ceremony. They were: Eu-

gene Chapter No. 6, represented by Secretary-Treasurer Fred Allen; Eulane Chapter No. 40, represented by President Leo Flanagan; Webfoot Chapter No. 49, represented by President Harold Prichard; U of O Faculty Chapter No. 77, represented by President Paul Simpson; and Emerald Chapter No. 88, represented by President Edna Eklof.

In addition to presenting the money to the Children's Hospital School, the Lane County state employees also donated \$40 to the OSEA hearing aid fund—a statewide project to provide hearing aids for needy students at the Oregon State School for the Deaf.

ANIMAL SHELTER PROJECT STARTED

Ground breaking ceremonies were held Saturday, May 29 for the District No. 9 animal shelter project being built at the Oregon State School for the Blind. Several Blind School students assisted an OSEA work party in laying the structure's cornerstone.

The shelter is being built by District No. 9 to enable the school's students to keep pets at the school for short periods of time. It will be part of a new park development program at the institution.

District Director Al Coulson said materials for the shelter will cost approximately \$450, of which \$325 has been raised. OSEA members will contribute their time and labor in constructing the structure.

2ND ANNUAL GOLF TOURNAMENT SET

Final arrangements for the second annual OSEA golf tournament are close to completion, according to Tournament Director Darryl Storm. The tournament will be held on Saturday, August 21 at the Salem Golf Club.

The entry fee will be the same as last year—\$5.00 per player. Of this amount, \$3.00 will be used to pay the player's green fee. The remaining \$2.00 will be used to pay the costs of refreshments and prizes.

Starting time begins at 10:17 sharp and ends at 12:17. The last foursome should be off the course by shortly after 4:00 p.m. The calloway system of scoring will be used with the tournament committee pre-selecting the handicap holes. The players will not be informed of the handicap holes until after they have completed their rounds.

Due to time restrictions, the tournament committee has limited the number of players to the first 60 to register. The golfers will be divided into six flights and will play in foursomes. Prizes will be awarded to the winners of each flight.

Refreshments will be served on picnic tables next to the first tee. Lunch will consist of cold cuts and beverages.

Last year the OSEA golf tournament drew 56 players from all over the state. Governor Mark O. Hatfield donated "The Governor's Trophy," a perpetual trophy on which the winners name is inscribed and kept in the OSEA headquarters office. The winner of last year's tournament was Roy R. Spivey from The Dalles.
