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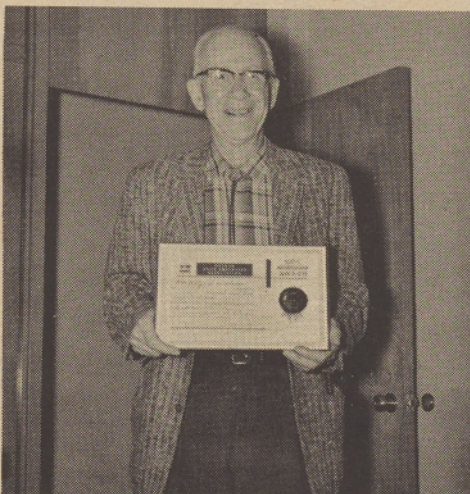

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THE INSURANCE CORNER

Q. As a state employee and a member of OSEA, can I apply for benefits under the OSEA Blue Cross and Standard Insurance Group programs at any time? (A.H.)

A. No. To be eligible for both group programs, other than through an open-enrollment period or proving insurability, you must apply within the first 60 days of your employment. (This does not mean after the six month probationary period).

If application is made for the OSEA Standard Life and Income Protection benefits after the first 60 days of employment, a statement of insurability must be completed. It is then the decision of the underwriting department to determine if you will or will not be accepted into the group. If not acceptable at that time, application can be made at a later date subject to approval, or application can be made during an open-enrollment period without evidence of insurability.

Application to Blue Cross can be acceptable only during the annual open-enrollment period (September 1 through October 6) if the new employee eligibility period is past.

Q. If I should drop my OSEA membership, could I continue my group insurance benefits? (S.J.)

A. No. Eligibility to participate in the OSEA group programs requires continuous membership in OSEA to make the insurance effective and to avoid any lapse in coverage. A cancellation or lapse in membership means cancellation of insurance benefits.

Q. It is my understanding that my life insurance benefits would not become effective if I should be off work on the designated date the insurance was to be in force. If not, when would it become effective? (S.M.)

A. The information you have is correct. Your life insurance or income protection benefits through the OSEA Standard Group policy would not become effective if you were not actively at work. This means for any cause whether it be vacation, sickness, etc. Further, it would not be in force until the day you did return to work. If for some reason you did not return until the following month, the premium you had paid for the preceding month would be returned to you as no coverage was actually in effect.

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
