\$2000 IN SIAC CHECKS WAITING TO BE CLAIMED

Robert F. Beck read his newspaper one day and learned someone wanted to give him \$1,019.

Twenty others throughout the state also have discovered new wealth in similar fashion, only in lesser degrees.

It began when the State Industrial Accident Commission compiled a list of 71 persons it could not find to forward compensation checks to for job injuries.

Daily and weekly newspapers throughout Oregon carried the list of names. Soon claimants who had moved without either leaving a forwarding address, or realizing they were entitled to compensation checks, began spotting their names.

So far a total of \$2,054 has been claimed by persons able to furnish proper identification. Still to be claimed is \$2,003.31.

The original list included two categories: 71 checks for those entitled to compensation benefits but who had not left forwarding addresses, and, 23 additional individuals who had uncashed checks which were not returned.

It wasn't long before Robert F. Beck, 45, a lumber industry worker with a family of six children, discovered in his newspaper in Springfield that he had six checks waiting for him at SIAC.

He promptly furnished proper identification to SIAC Cashier Ted Ullakko and a certified check for \$1,019.37 was on its way the same day.

The reasons why claimants do not pick up checks are varied. Most apparently file a claim with SIAC, then move, not realizing they have awards coming. When no forwarding address is left by the claimant, SIAC is left with the alternative of reaching him via his newspaper.
