

## Blood Drive Successful

A Red Cross blood drive, sponsored by OSEA District No. 2, was termed "very successful" by Mrs. C. E. Jaqua, Red Cross Bloodmobile Coordinator for the Salem area. It was held July 30 at the Capitol.

## THE INSURANCE CORNER

Since the open-enrollment period for both the OSEA Blue Cross and Standard Insurance programs is approaching, I would like to devote the column this month to items relative to each program. The open-enrollment period for both programs is September 1 through October 6. The effective date of the insurance will be November 1.

### OSEA BLUE CROSS (Medical-Hospital)

(1) Due to the increase in some of the benefits effective November 1, it is important to point out to present subscribers that if hospitalized continuously prior to and after November 1, the benefits will not change effective November 1, but will change as soon as discharged from the hospital. If re-admitted, even for the same condition, the new benefits will become applicable. For those persons entering the hospital on or after November 1, the new benefits will be in effect.

(2) You may change from one plan to another only during the open-enrollment period. If you make such a change in plans, you must complete a new application and indicate on the face of it that you are changing plans.

(3) If you have married or had any newborn children and neglected to insure them within the specified time, you may do so during the open-enrollment period. A new application must be completed in this instance also.

(4) Unlike the Standard Insurance program, any employee who has been employed for more than 60 days cannot prove insurability and obtain coverage anytime during the year except during the Blue Cross open-enrollment period.

### OSEA STANDARD INSURANCE (Life and Income Protection)

(1) This is the first open-enrollment period in two years for the OSEA Standard Life and Income Protection program. This does not necessarily mean there will be another period in two years or any specific time in the future as it will depend upon the loss experience of the group. Therefore, your OSEA Insurance Committee strongly recommends that everyone take advantage of this opportunity to enroll during this period without having to prove insurability.

(2) It is not required that you enroll for both life and income protection (weekly benefits) as neither program is dependent upon the other; however, if you enroll for one during the open-enrollment period and later decide to add the other, it would then be necessary to prove insurability. If declined by the underwriting department, you would need to wait for a future open-enrollment period to obtain the desired coverage.

(3) Those persons who are presently enrolled in the program and who are desirous of adding either the life or income protection must complete a new application indicating which coverage they are adding.

(4) You cannot insure your life for a greater principal sum than is listed on the brochures. This sum is based upon your monthly salary.

(5) Both husband and wife may enroll in the program if both are full-time state employees. If they have children, unmarried and under the age of 22, both may pay the slight additional charge for the dependent coverage thereby insuring the spouse for an additional \$1,000 plus each child for \$2,000 (\$1,000 from each insured). If there are no children, it is optional whether dependent premiums are paid to insure the spouse provided that both are enrolled for life benefits. If only one is carrying the life benefits, then dependent premiums must be paid to insure the spouse.

### BOTH PROGRAMS

(1) In order to be eligible for both the OSEA Blue Cross and Standard Insurance programs, you must:

- Be a full-time state employee working a minimum of 20 hours per week.
- Become a member of (and maintain continuous membership in) OSEA.

(2) Applications and brochures for both programs may be obtained from:

- Personnel and payroll offices in state agencies.
- Chapter president, secretary-treasurer, or insurance representative.
- Insurance department at the OSEA headquarters office.
