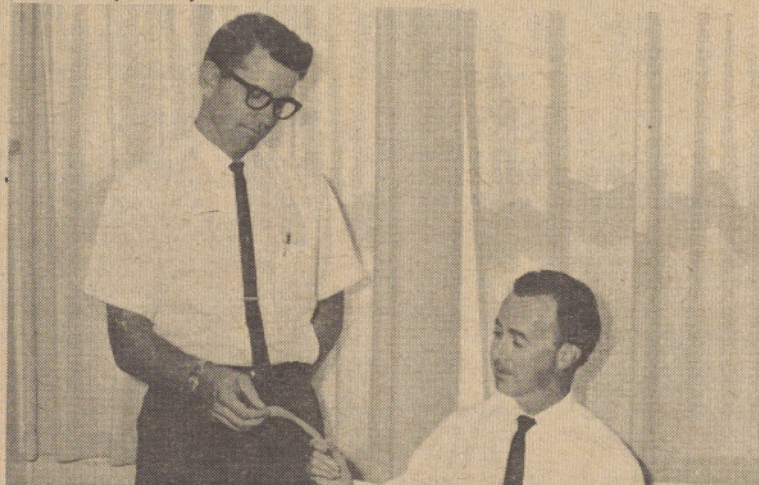

OSEA Charter Member Dies

A long-time state employee who was instrumental in the formation of the Oregon State Employees Association in 1943 died in Milwaukie, Oregon on January 31.

J. Claude Moore, Milwaukie Section Foreman for the State Highway Department, was a charter member of Rose City Chapter 5 in Portland. Long active in OSEA affairs, he served as chapter president and delegate to General Council.

Starting employment with the Highway Department in 1927, Moore worked as a laborer, truck driver, materials inspector and chairman through the years. He was appointed foreman at Milwaukie in 1941.

Richard C. Mayhew, Secretary-Treasurer for Chapter 5, said "Claude was a good friend and all of us are sorry that he is gone."
