District No. 1

MERCURY CHAPTER 39 heard a discussion of collective bargaining by District No. 1 Director Glen Snyder. Chapter members voted a \$50 contribution to the OSEA scholarship fund.

District No. 5

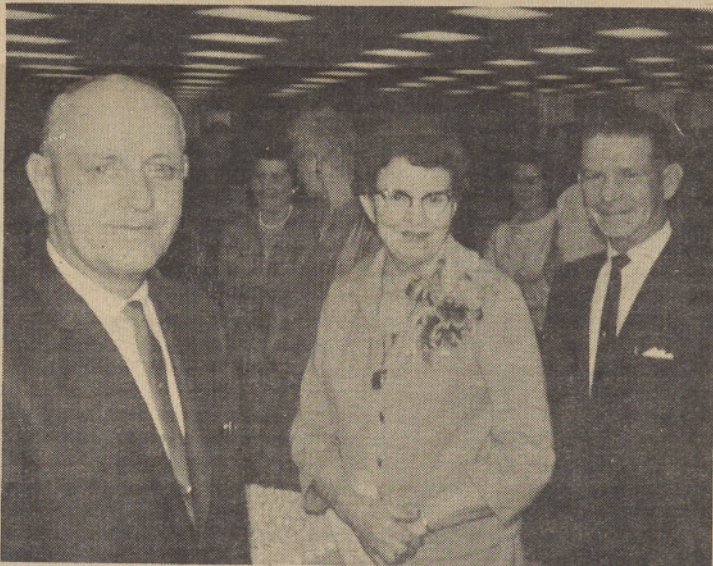
