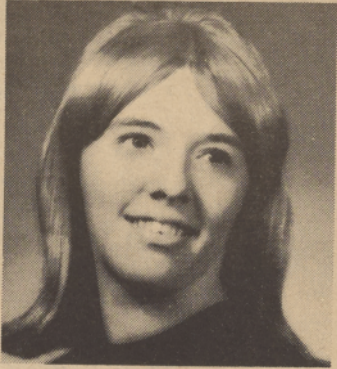


# OSEA Scholarship and Grant-In-Aid Recipients

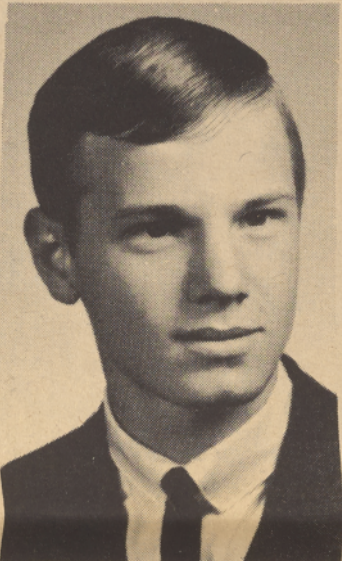
VICTORINE LeCOMPTE

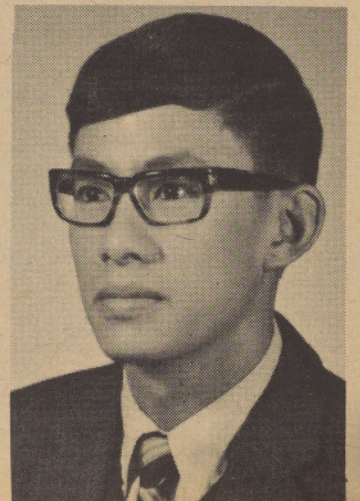
MARY GARRARD

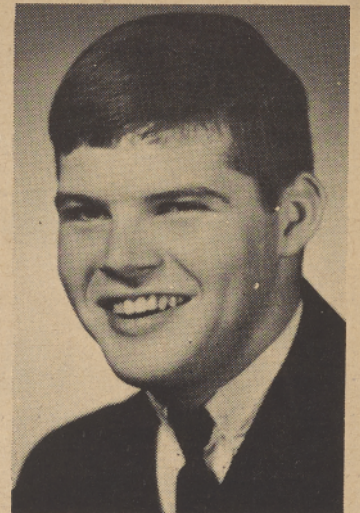
CAREY WONG

MICHAEL BROWN

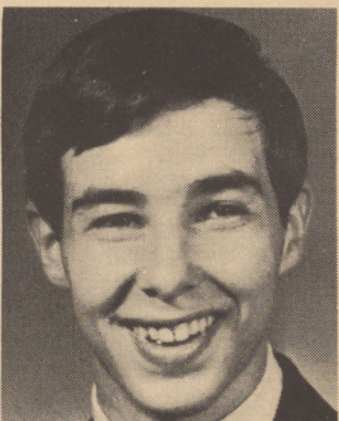

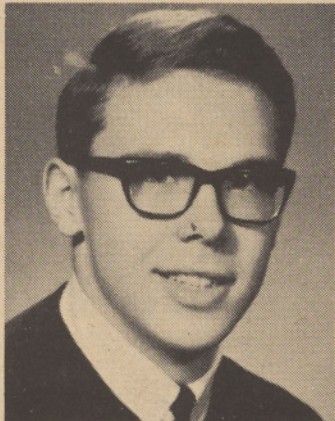

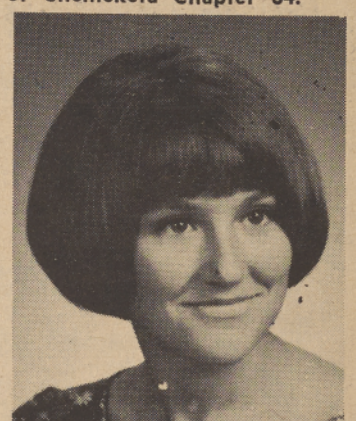
