

# Drive for Academic Members Underway

An effort to increase OSEA's membership among the state's nearly 6,000 academic employees is presently being undertaken by Dr. George Arscott and his Academic and Unclassified Services Committee.

The effort will focus on non-members working at every college under the State System of Higher Education.

As the first step, Arscott has sent a letter to every non-member of academic rank inviting him to join.

In addition, the presidents and individual members of OSEA faculty chapters on each campus will contact non-members among their colleagues and encourage them to enroll to help support OSEA's activities on behalf of academic employees.

In his letter, Arscott pointed out that OSEA and its faculty chapters undertook a campaign to influence the 1969 Legislature on behalf of academic salaries.

"A letter writing campaign among the faculties and our 16,000 members was organized. Over 200 of OSEA's faculty members and their colleagues throughout the state were present at the public hearing when our lobbyists and faculty representatives presented the case for academic salaries to the Legislature," he said.

"We believe that OSEA has consistently demonstrated that there is no more effective organization in this state to accomplish these goals. With a large professional staff, with specialists in every area of state employment including higher education and with statewide membership of 16,000, we have a proven capacity to obtain practical results for our faculty members," Arscott said.

Presently, OSEA has about 1,400 members among academic employees. Arscott said he hopes to increase that number substantially.

## New Enrollment Help Available

Chapter Membership Committees and individual members have been urged by Membership Director Betty French to use the new state employee leave records, available at headquarters, to enroll new members.

She said they should be given to non-members when being invited to join the association.

Each record contains a 1969 calendar listing state holidays. There is a space under each day of each month for listing hours of sick, vacation, education, military and compensatory and other leaves with or without pay.

# OSEA Golf Tournament Scheduled August 16

OSEA's sixth annual golf tournament will be held Saturday, August 16, at the Salem Golf Club, according to Chalmers Jones, chairman of the Tournament Committee.

"We have made arrangements early so that members will have plenty of time to plan to enter this year's tournament," Jones said.

OSEA was able to obtain only limited starting times. For that reason, the tournament will be limited to 16 foursomes, or 64 players.

Jones urged those who want to participate to enter as soon as possible. Only the first 64 entrants will be accepted.

The entry fee will again be \$6 per player. Of that amount, \$4 will be used to pay green fees and \$2 will go towards the cost of prizes and refreshments.

For members of the Salem Golf Club the entry fee will be \$2.

The tournament will begin at 7 a.m. when the first foursome is scheduled to start. A foursome will follow every eight minutes.

As in past years, a "blind bogey" system will be used to compute net scores.

Jones said the Tournament Committee will pre-select four handicap holes. Players will not be informed of the holes until after they have completed their rounds.

A percentage of the strokes over par on the handicap holes will be subtracted from the gross scores to determine the net scores.

Players will be divided into six flights. Prizes will be awarded to the winners of each flight. In addition, numerous miscellaneous prizes will be awarded.

A picnic lunch will be served on the golf course next to the ninth green at the conclusion of the tournament.

Winner of the championship flight will have his name inscribed on the Governor's Trophy, a perpetual trophy donated to OSEA by former Gov. Mark O. Hatfield. It is kept on display at headquarters.

Last year's tournament drew some 87 golfers from throughout the state. Flight winners were Cliff Allison, championship flight; Ken Gowan, first flight; Roy Priem, second flight; Odell Wood, third flight; Rene Casillas, fourth flight; and Jim Schwitter, fifth flight.

## Solons Adopt Holiday Shift

Primary and general election days every two years will no longer be holidays for state employees, but the loss is more than offset by insuring they get four holidays every year.

A bill passed by the 1969 Legislature creates four three-day holidays by shifting the holiday date to Monday. They are:

Lincoln's birthday, now Feb. 12, becomes the first Monday in February.

Washington's birthday, now Feb. 22, becomes the third Monday in February.

Memorial Day, now May 30, becomes the last Monday in May.

Veterans Day, now Nov. 11, becomes the fourth Monday in October.

OSEA representatives said although the bill deletes the election day holidays, the loss will be more than offset by the fact that the other four holidays will no longer be lost to state employees by falling on Saturdays.

The change in state holidays conforms to the new federal holiday schedule. It also fulfills a resolution adopted by OSEA's 1968 General Council.

The new schedule becomes effective Jan. 1, 1971.
