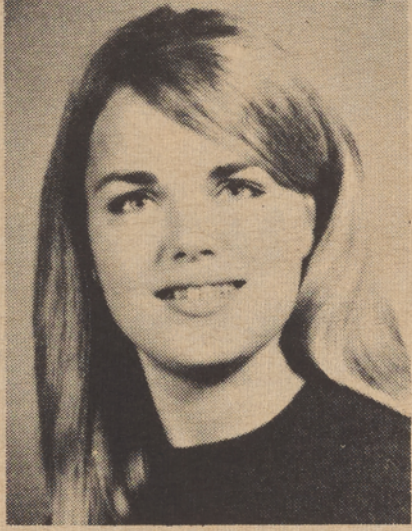


OSEA Scholarship and Grant-in-Aid Recipients



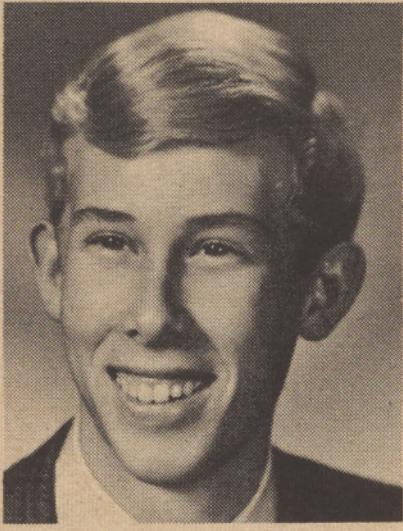
CHRISTINE M. BELLEQUE

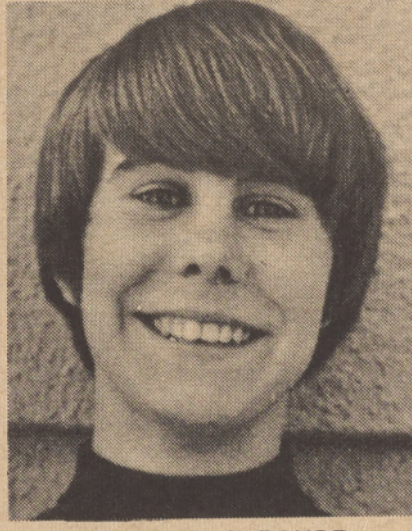
DARLENE G. DODD

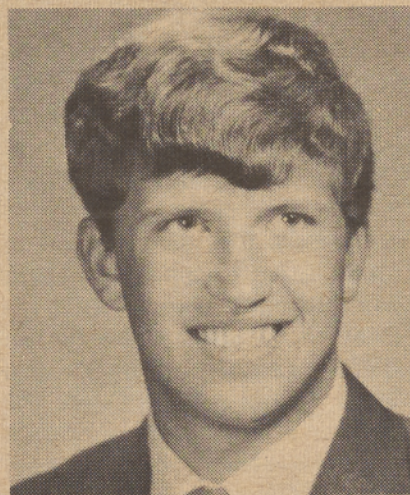
ELLEN J. HOPPER

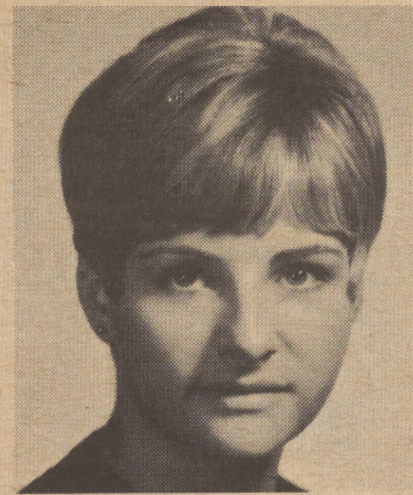
LANOR L. SANDY

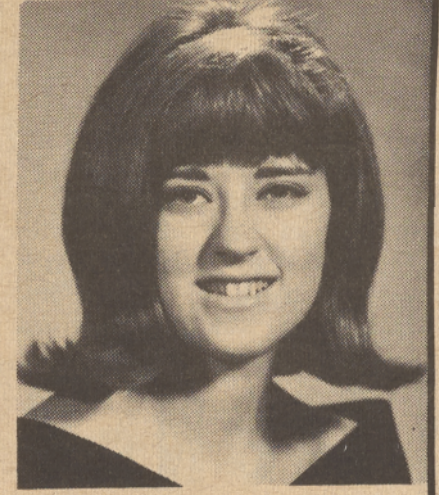
JACQUELYN N. LONG

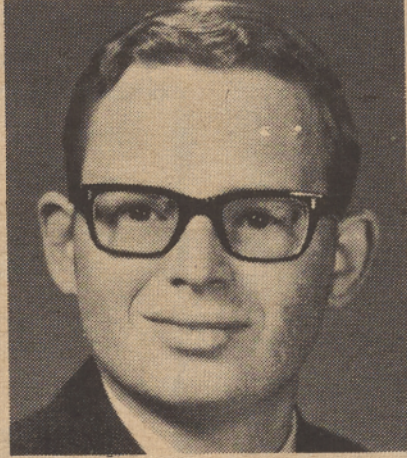
NOVELLA S. STURGEON

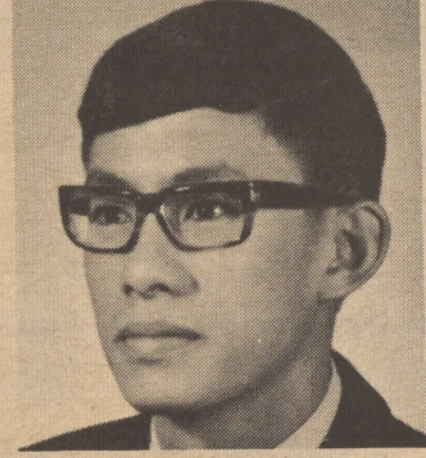
DENNIS J. GRAVES
